Compass Card with you.



**BUS**

**1.**

Know before you go! Use  
the online Trip Planner at  
[translink.ca](http://translink.ca) or Google Maps.

**2.**

Walk to the stop, look at  
the sign. Check to see if  
your bus is on time.



**Kids 12 & under can now ride the bus for free.  
They do not have to tap in on the bus, show  
identification or be accompanied by a fare  
paying customer. See more information about  
this program at the back page.**

3.

Watch and wait for the bus. What other buses visit this stop?



4.

Hold on tight! Watch for your stop. Pull the cord when you want to get off.



5.

Once the bus stops, go out the back door. Give a thumbs up to the operator!





**SKYTRAIN,  
SEABUS, AND  
WEST COAST  
EXPRESS**

To get to the SkyTrain, SeaBus, or West Coast Express, you'll need to enter through a fare gate with someone who has a Compass Ticket or a Compass Card. A maximum of 4 kids can accompany a fare paying customer.

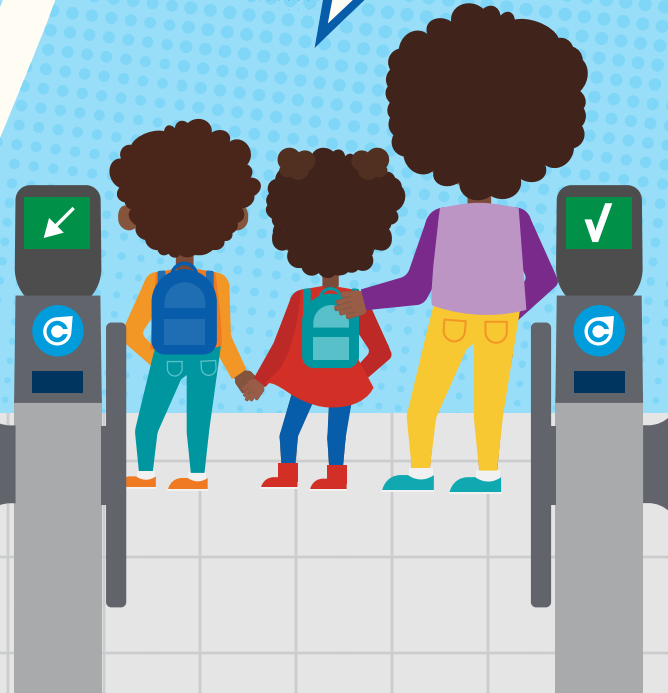


**1.**

Choose one of the wide gates to pass through. Reminder: tap in on the right.

**2.**

Once the gate opens, walk through together and stay close to each other.

When waiting for your train, stand well behind the yellow line on the platform.

Once the train arrives, allow others to exit the train before you step inside.

Remove your backpack and keep priority seats open for people that need them. Hold on and enjoy the ride!

## KIDS 12 & UNDER RIDE FREE



As of Sept. 1, 2021, children 12 and under can ride TransLink services free of charge as part of a provincial program. This change makes it easier and more affordable for families in and around Metro Vancouver.

### ***NOTE TO PARENTS AND GUARDIANS***

While travel for children 12 and under is free, parents and guardians are responsible for educating and making decisions about the safety and care of their children whenever travelling on transit. This includes when children are travelling unaccompanied and determining if their children can or should take transit unaccompanied.
