
## Coming up: More Service!

We're making several changes to improve service next Monday. Let's take a swing around and see what's going to happen.

First of all, the Macdonald line is being extended West on 16th Avenue to Blenheim, providing a better service to passengers in this area. Some (not all) buses will make this run—and all of you who live out that way will be getting a schedule in the mail so you can get aboard with a minimum of waiting.


At the outer end of the Macdonald route, we're hooking in a new bus line. This will give better service to residents south of 41st Avenue between Macdonald and Dunbar.





Called the Macdonald-Marine-Dunbar line, the new service will be routed from 41st and Mackenzie via Macdonald, 49th, S.W. Marine, Dunbar, to 41st; returning

via Dunbar, S.W. Marine, Macdonald, 44th, Mackenzie, to 41st and Mackenzie. Please note that the Macdonald loop is in the opposite direction to the one



being made at present time.

Except for some "through" buses in the rush hours and late at night, the present Macdonald service will now terminate at 41st Avenue.

### Hastings East

No. 14 (Hastings East) street cars will be re-routed, on Sundays and holidays only, to help provide a very frequent service to Stanley Park. They'll travel via Hastings, Granville, Pender and Georgia, to the Park terminal. On other days, of course, you'll find them on their usual route. The first time this new arrangement will take effect will be Wednesday, the 24th of May.

### Richmond Schedules

Some major changes are coming up in the Grauer-

Miller and Airport services. These are effective Monday, May 22, and we're sure you'll find the new times a good deal more convenient.

New schedule cards will be available beforehand in all Richmond buses and at the Marpole Depot. Or write The Buzzer.

### And Burnaby, Too

North Burnaby schedules are being changed next Monday, too. The way it's been, you've had several buses coming along Hastings within a short time, then a gap, then several more.

The new schedules are aimed to iron things out, so that service is available at more nearly even intervals.

Routes affected are: Hastings-Warwick, Capitol Hill, Hastings-Duthie, Hastings-Bainbridge and Hastings-Borden.
