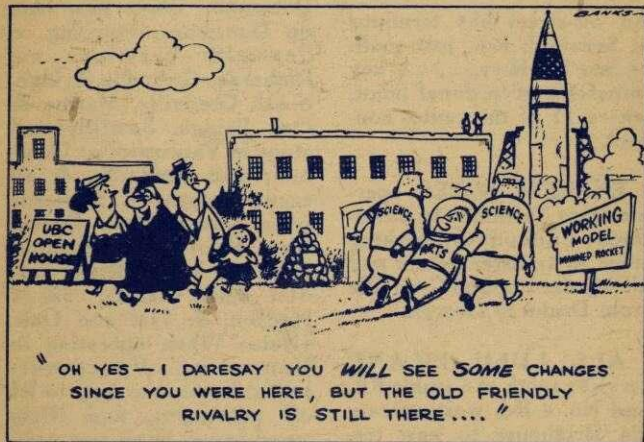
Tropical Fish
