Transit buses handled huge Conference moves

The Transportation Division recently concluded supplying regular and special transportation services to the largest conference held in Vancouver. The International Congress of Mathematicians brought together about 6000 delegates from around the world. The transit system supplied charter buses for moving delegates between downtown Vancouver and the University of British Columbia and other points. This was a huge undertaking complicated by coinciding with the heavy Pacific National Exhibition traffic. Its success was made possible by the excellent cooperation of our transit operators who volunteered for charter trips and for overtime work. The largest single move was on the opening day of the congress when almost 2000 delegates were moved from the UBC where they were housed to the Queen Elizabeth Theatre. A total of 39 buses were required for this operation.

"School certificates are for showing." Certificates issued in 1973 can be used to September 15. Those issued in 1974 are now valid, and will be the only ones accepted by operators after September 15.

Granville Mall Service

Transit buses are expected to move back on to Granville Street commencing Sunday, September 15, to operate through the new mall. Most services which previously were on Granville prior to commencement of construction of the mall will be back, plus the express service inbound from Richmond. Specials to football games at Empire Stadium and hockey games in the Coliseum will return to Granville, too, but race express buses will continue to use Seymour Street.
