# PURPOSE

To provide a report on the activities, outcomes and costs of *Metro Vancouver Transit Days in Ottawa*.

### BACKGROUND

At the direction of the Mayors' Council, the <u>Access for Everyone campaign</u> was developed beginning in January 2023, <u>launched on May 11, 2023</u>, and is planned through to the end of 2023 (leading into upcoming federal and provincial elections). The goals of the campaign are to:

- a. Secure federal commitment to accelerate the delivery of the Permanent Transit Fund to 2024/25 to fund the <u>Transport 2050: 10-Year Priorities</u> (10YP).
- b. Generate commitment from federal and provincial governments to engage in the development of a new, sustainable funding model for public transit and support the delivery of the 10-Year Priorities starting in mid-2024.

Key elements of the campaign will include government relations (including at least two trips to Ottawa), media relations, public and stakeholder engagement through social media advertising and local community meetings and events and an updated website.

The scope and budget for this new campaign is similar to the successful Cure Congestion campaign undertaken in 2017 in the lead up to the 2017 provincial election which secured a commitment from the new government to fund 40% of all capital costs of the Mayors' Council *10-Year Vision* transit expansion plan. See Annex 1 for a history of the Mayors' Council advocacy efforts and outcomes. Using TransLink's open procurement process, the Mayors' Council Secretariat identified and secured the services of a public affairs firm, Earnscliffe Strategies, to support the development and implementation of this new campaign. The Mayors' Council has allocated \$500,000 from its budget envelope to support this campaign, with a request for additional support from TransLink. A complete accounting of campaign expenditures will be provided in a public report at the end of the campaign as per usual practice.

The Access for Everyone campaign plans for at least two Metro Vancouver Transit Days in Ottawa, with one held in spring 2023, and another proposed for Fall 2023 in the pre-budget period.

# DISCUSSION

Following the Access for Everyone campaign launch on May 11, 2023, Metro Vancouver Transit Days in Ottawa was held on May 15-17, 2023 with a delegation of 12 members of the Mayors' Council. The objectives of Metro Vancouver Transit Days in Ottawa in May 2023 were to:

- Raise awareness of the Mayors' Council's asks of the Government of Canada and all parties heading into 2024 federal budget and the next federal election (see <u>2023/24 Federal Budget</u> <u>Submission</u>), which includes a federal matching contribution to the Province of B.C.'s emergency relief funding for TransLink provided in March 2023.
- 2. Inform Members of Parliament (MPs) of the *Access for Everyone* campaign so they are aware that members of the public may be contacting them to urge support for Mayors' Council asks.
- 3. Build relationships with key MPs and ministers from all parties.
- 4. Demonstrate Mayors' Council leadership in advocating for senior government funding support for the 10-Year Priorities.

The Mayors' Council delegation met with 22 MPs (12 Liberal, 7 Conservative and 3 NDP) including Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, Infrastructure and Communities, Dominic LeBlanc and his Parliamentary Secretary Jennifer O'Connell. Meetings were also held with Official Opposition Leader Pierre Poilievre and NDP Leader Jagmeet Singh. In addition, the delegation hosted a reception for government officials and stakeholders in the Wellington Building in the Parliamentary Precinct which was attended by 8 MPs, staff from the Prime Minister's office, Finance Minister's office and various other MP and ministerial staff, as well as stakeholders representing transit and transportation organizations, the Federation of Canadian Municipalities, the Canadian Urban Transit Association and others. Although the delegation met MPs from every region and all parties, members heard several common themes, questions, and requests for follow-up:

- Investment in public transit is viewed as critical to achieving GHG reduction targets and supporting affordability and quality of life in urban regions. MPs from all parties expressed support for transit expansion.
- The current government believes its performance on transit has been good and significant investments have already been made in recent years. Still, there was recognition of the increased immigration targets creating challenges for managing growth in cities.
- There was no immediate solution offered for the proposal to accelerate the Permanent Transit Fund by two years, however Ministers and government MPs were open to further discussions.
- Government continues to view transit investments primarily on a project basis several meetings included requests for information on the costs of specific projects within the 10-year Priorities.

# Media coverage

Prior to the Ottawa delegation, a <u>news release was issued on May 10, 2023</u>, to promote the Mayors' Council's asks of the federal government and generate awareness of the upcoming trip. Media coverage of the release included The Globe and Mail, Global BC and CBC Vancouver. An op ed authored by the Chair of the Mayors' Council was published in the Hill Times during *Metro Vancouver Transit Days in Ottawa*, to increase the profile of the Mayors' Council visit. A full list of media coverage and audience impression metrics is provided in Annex 3.

Posts on the Mayors' Council Twitter account generated a total of 62,151 views, 507 likes and 130 shares. Digital advertising – using the approved creative concept and new Access for Everyone brand – was targeted to the Ottawa region and specifically Parliament Hill, during the delegation's visit. Primary audiences for the first wave of advertising were the Ottawa political market: federal elected officials and civil servants in key departments – Infrastructure, Environment, and Finance. Placements were focused on websites with high frequency ad views, well-read sources like National News Watch and Hill Times.com, as well as Twitter, LinkedIn and Google.

The Mayors' Council Executive Director, Mike Buda, organized meetings, developed briefing materials, accompanied the delegation to provide support in their meetings with MPs, and met separately with federal officials and ministerial staffers. TransLink CEO Kevin Desmond and Vice President of Transportation Planning and Policy Sarah Ross travelled to Ottawa during the same period for meetings with officials from Infrastructure and Communities Canada, and to support the delegation in targeted MP meetings.

All travel, food and accommodation expenses incurred by the Mayors' Council by each delegation member will be shown for each Mayors' Council member and staff in TransLink's 2023 Financial Information Act report. Given that the annual FIA report is not available until after the end of the calendar year, a summary of these expenses to attend *Metro Vancouver Transit Days in Ottawa* is provided in this report for greater transparency. Travel, food, accommodation, and the legislated daily Mayors' Council member remuneration for 12 Mayors' Council members and the Executive Director to attend the *Metro Vancouver Transit Days in Ottawa* totaled \$45,857.

# Next steps

All MPs who met with Mayors' Council delegation members will receive a follow-up letter to thank them for their time, to share again information on the *Access for Everyone* campaign including our requests for the 2024 federal budget and to provide a follow-up response to any specific requests or questions that they raised.

At least one and likely two more trips to Ottawa are proposed in Fall 2023 to leverage Ottawa's focus on the Fall Economic Statement (usually released at the end of October) and the pre-budget consultation period (late-September to February). The 2024 federal budget is an immediate focus of the *Access for Everyone* campaign given the need for additional federal funding to support the 2024 Investment Plan. Being present in Ottawa during the traditional pre-budget period will be important to ensuring our asks are heard and pressure for action felt. The mission will also be leveraged for local media and public outreach to kick start the final stage of the campaign here in Metro Vancouver.

# History of Mayors' Council Senior Government and Public Advocacy

In early 2016, the Mayors' Council launched a public advocacy strategy to push for "fair-share" funding. It convinced the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) to update its position on the issue. In response to the pressure from FCM, the Mayors' Council and other big cities, the newly elected federal government announced a 10-year, \$20 billion transit funding program that would deliver funding more predictably and at a 40% capital cost share. This new funding commitment – several times larger than previous federal transit funding programs and with a greater cost share – was foundational to approving the Phase One Plan in late 2016.

Based on the success of this limited but energetic public advocacy campaign in 2016, the Mayors' Council approved a \$400,000 public engagement and voter mobilization campaign in advance of the 2017 provincial election, with the aim of securing commitments from both major parties to support the delivery of the remaining elements of the 10-Year Vision. The "Cure Congestion" campaign reached tens of thousands of residents through paid advertising, direct engagement, and via stakeholder outreach and led to both parties making new commitments to transit and transportation. The NDP made a commitment to fund 40% of all remaining projects in the 10-Year Vision (as opposed to a share of specific projects favoured by the government of the day, as had been the case previously) that served as the government's policy through the to current Investment Plan that was approved in May 2022.

The Mayors' Council launched a new, smaller and more targeted campaign to secure new federal funding in late 2018 that included several "Metro Vancouver Transit Days" visits to Ottawa to engage directly with ministers and MPs, public engagement, continued close coordination with FCM and other key big cities, and a reprise of the Cure Congestion campaign in advance of the 2019 federal election. These efforts culminated with the 2021 federal budget that included:

- \$5.9 billion in stimulus funding in 2021-25 for zero-emission buses (\$2.7 billion), active transportation (\$400 million), rural transit (\$150 million) and major transit projects (\$2.5 billion) which staff estimated in 2021 would provide \$650 million in total to TransLink
- \$3 billion per year Permanent Transit Fund (PTF), beginning in 2026-27, which will provide TransLink with approximately \$340 million annually for capital projects.
- The continuation of the federal Gas Tax Fund (now called the Canada Community-Building Fund (CCBF)) which delivers ~\$140 million annually to TransLink via Metro Vancouver.

In coordination with FCM, the Mayors' Council approved a submission to the federal government's Permanent Transit Fund (PTF) consultation at its September 29, 2022 meeting that calls for the Gas Tax Fund to be permanently doubled, and to accelerate the start of PTF to 2024 to support the first phase of the *Transport 2050: 10-Year Priorities*.
