Resolutions from the In-Camera Meeting of the Mayors' Council on Regional Transportation held on March 24, 2023:

## It was MOVED and SECONDED

That the Mayors' Council on Regional Transportation (Mayors' Council):

1. Work with the Mayors' Council, TransLink Board of Directors and TransLink staff to book up to five *Policymaker Study Tours* of bus rapid transit systems in North America and Europe in the summer/fall 2023, finalize the planning and budgeting and report back on the schedule and logistics of the study tours as soon as possible

## It was MOVED and SECONDED

That the Mayors' Council on Regional Transportation (Mayors' Council):

- 1. Amend its 2023 Meeting Policy such that at least four more regular monthly meetings of the Mayors' Council are organized in-person (on average every other month) in 2023, with the remaining regular monthly meetings of the Mayors' Council held via videoconference;
- 2. Ask the Chair to confirm the meeting format for each meeting at the preceding meeting;
- 3. Ask the Executive Director and Mayors' Council Chair to request that Metro Vancouver allow the Mayors' Council to hold its monthly in-person meetings in the Metro Vancouver boardroom;
- 4. Ask the Executive Director to investigate the ability to hold hybrid meetings in the Metro Vancouver boardroom;

That the Mayors' Council on Regional Transportation (Mayors' Council):

- 1. Ask the Public Affairs and Governance Committee to proceed with completing and implementing a 12 to 14-month advocacy campaign to build public and senior government support for the *Transport 2050: 10-Year Priorities*;
- 2. Direct up to \$500,000 from the Mayors' Council unallocated budget allocation to support the campaign;
- 1. Ask the Public Affairs and Governance Committee to oversee the campaign and budget and report back to the Mayors' Council for approval
