#640 service now operating hourly

The Vancouver Regional Transit Commission recently approved the introduction of hourly service during off-peak periods, Monday through Friday, and all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays, effective April 20.

The hourly service between Scottsdale Mall, Ladner Exchange and the Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal provides North Delta residents with an easy connection to Richmond and Vancouver buses at Ladner Exchange.

Bus loop moved to facilitate construction at Metrotown

Passengers transferring at Metrotown Station are already using a new bus loop on Central Boulevard, east of Sussex Drive. The relocation of the loop was necessary to allow construction to proceed on the new Eaton Centre Galleria. When the Galleria is completed in 1988, a semi-enclosed bus loop will be an integral part of the Centre. SkyTrain passengers will be able to get to and from the loop and the shopping centre, quickly and safely, on a pedestrian bridge. It is expected that by the year 2001, the Metrotown area will be the second most densely developed area in Greater Vancouver. Its central location and easy accessibility by SkyTrain and the integrated feeder bus system, have been and will continue to be major factors in its development. Travel time from downtown Vancouver by SkyTrain is only 15 minutes.

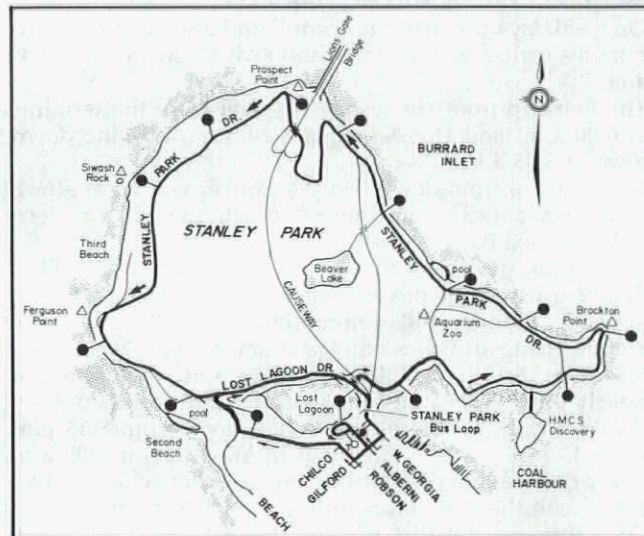

Sunday and holiday Around the Park service has resumed

With the arrival of spring, BC Transit is once again operating its service around Stanley Park, Sundays and holidays, from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Service frequency depends on weather conditions; minimum service is once an hour, but when the weather is fine a bus leaves Chilco Loop every 20 minutes. Bus stops are located at convenient locations around the park.

West Vancouver "Blue Bus" service changes

effective May 4, 1987

250 Horseshoe Bay/Vancouver

On weekdays the first trip from Dundarave will leave five minutes earlier, at 5:44 a.m., and arrive downtown at 6:08 a.m.

The first trip from Horseshoe Bay will leave the terminus at 6:00 a.m. and Dundarave at 6:20 a.m., arriving downtown at 6:45 a.m.

The first trip from downtown Vancouver will leave at 6:10 a.m., providing a better connection with the 7:00 a.m. ferry at Horseshoe Bay.

In the p.m. peak period, the 5:35 and 5:59 p.m. 250 Dundarave trips will be discontinued because of low ridership levels. In addition, the evening schedule to Horseshoe Bay will be changed: buses will leave downtown Vancouver at 5:50 p.m., 6:20 p.m., 7:05 p.m., 7:35 p.m., 8:05 p.m. and hourly until 12:05 a.m. Short-turn trips to Dundarave will depart hourly, on the alternate half hour, from 8:35 p.m. to 11:35 p.m., with a final trip to West Bay at 1:05 a.m. These changes are designed to improve connections at Park Royal with the #239 buses to/from North Vancouver.

On Saturdays the first trip will leave Dundarave at 5:44 a.m., arriving downtown at 6:08 a.m. The return trip will leave the downtown terminus at 6:10 a.m., five minutes earlier than at present. In addition, the 9:00 a.m. trip from Horseshoe Bay will leave five minutes later, at 9:05 a.m., and arrive downtown at 9:55 a.m.

Saturday evening service will be changed to follow the weekday schedule: Dundarave and Horseshoe Bay buses will leave downtown Vancouver at 05 and 35 minutes past the hour, beginning at 7:05 p.m.

On Sundays and holidays, between 3:05 p.m. and 6:05 p.m., service from Vancouver to Dundarave will be increased to provide a bus every 15 minutes. This will alleviate the overcrowding that has existed. Alternate #250 buses will continue past Dundarave to Horseshoe Bay, pro-

viding 30-minute service between Vancouver and Horseshoe Bay.

251 Queens/Park Royal

Evening schedules for weekdays and Saturday will be changed: buses will leave Park Royal at 55 minutes past the hour, from 6:55 p.m. to 11:55 p.m. In addition, the first trip, Saturday morning service will be extended to downtown Vancouver thereby eliminating the need to transfer to the #250 bus at Ambleside. Scheduled departure times from 11th & Inglewood will change to 8:08 a.m., 9:00 a.m. and each 60 minutes thereafter.

252 Inglewood/Park Royal

Evening departure times from Park Royal, Monday through Saturday, will change to 25 minutes after the hour. Buses will leave hourly from 6:25 p.m. to 12:25 a.m.

After the first trip, Saturday morning service will be extended to downtown Vancouver, eliminating the need to transfer to the #250 bus at Ambleside. Scheduled departure times from 11th & Inglewood will change to 8:38 a.m., 9:30 a.m. and each 60 minutes thereafter.

253 Cypress Park/Vancouver

P.M. peak period schedules will be changed: buses will leave downtown Vancouver at 5:35 p.m., 6:05 p.m. and 6:35 p.m. instead of 5:42 p.m., 6:05 p.m. and 6:25 p.m. Between 5:20 and 6:35 p.m., the #253 and #250 services will together offer 15-minute service westbound on Marine to 31st Street.

Weekday evening trips will leave Park Royal at 8:25 and 10:25 p.m. instead of 7:57 and 9:57 p.m.

On Saturdays, the trip that presently leaves Park Royal at 6:47 p.m. will be operated from Vancouver, leaving the terminus at 6:35 p.m. and Park Royal at 6:51 p.m.

254 British Properties/Park Royal

The departure time of the first trip from Vancouver on weekday mornings, will change to 7:50 a.m. It will leave Park Royal at 8:07 a.m. and arrive at Bonnymuir & Glenmore at 8:19 a.m. The evening schedule will also be changed to improve connections with the #239 and #250 services. Buses will leave Park Royal at 6:25, 7:25, 9:25 and 10:55 p.m.

257 Horseshoe Bay Express/Vancouver Express

The trip that presently leaves Horseshoe Bay at 7:22 a.m. will leave ten minutes earlier, at 7:12 a.m., and arrive in downtown Vancouver at 7:45 a.m. This will provide a bet-

ter connection with the ferry that arrives from Langdale at 7:00 a.m.

258 West Vancouver/UBC

Direct UBC service will be discontinued at the end of the examination period. Service will be reinstated at the start of the winter session, in September.

New timetables will be available from "Blue Bus" operators and regular sources, including the West Vancouver Library and Municipal Hall.

Peak period transfer to/from 28 Phibbs Exchange/Joyce Station buses

Passengers travelling on #28 buses are reminded that the part of the route between Boundary Road at Hastings and Joyce Station, inclusive, is common to Zones 1 and 2B. This gives passengers who have paid a single zone fare the option of transferring to Vancouver or Burnaby-bound buses at selected transfer locations.

During peak periods, passengers may transfer to or from any of the following routes, at the following locations, with a single-zone yellow transfer/receipt or pass.

Kootenay Loop — all Vancouver services (10, 14, 27).

Hastings at Boundary — all Burnaby services in Zone 2B.

Boundary at Lougheed — #9 to/from Vancouver or to/from Brentwood.

Kincaid at Smith — #25 to/from Brentwood.

Boundary at Vanness — to/from Zone 2B on #19, by walking to/from Kingsway on Boundary Road.

Joyce Station — all Vancouver bus services (26, 27, 41), and SkyTrain travelling west of Joyce Station.

A two-zone fare (red transfer/receipt, pass or supplement fare) applies to the following locations and routes:

Kootenay Loop — travelling to/from Zone 2B, or to/from North Vancouver.

Kincaid at Smith — crossing to/from Vancouver on #25 (#25 is fully within the Burnaby fare zone at this location).

Joyce Station — crossing to/from Burnaby (Patterson Station or beyond).
