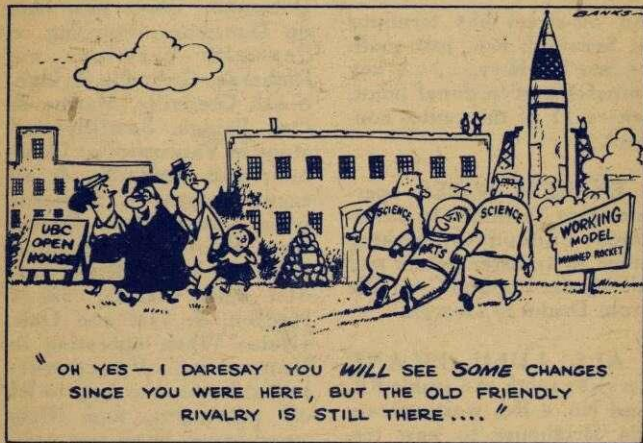
Tropical Fish

## Richmond's New All-Bus Service

BUSES started operating on 12 new routes in Richmond today, replacing the former system of seven routes, including tramline, and providing expanded service throughout the area.

### MAIN IMPROVEMENTS:

An off-street bus terminus at Sexsmith Rd., just south of Sea Isl. Hwy., . . . a key transfer and terminal point, where 11 of the routes connect.

EXPRESS BUSES operate from Terminus to downtown Vancouver, making stops at transfer points and all regular stops on Granville from Drake to Georgia.

ALL LULU ISLAND services south of Cambie Rd. and No. 4 Rd. west operate via Brighthouse to new terminus.

STEVESTON residents have a choice of three bus routes, all of which operate via Brighthouse to new terminus.

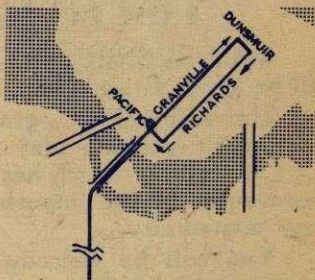
SEA ISLAND service also runs to new terminus.

NO. 5 ROAD—CAMBIE service operates to terminus from Marine and Fraser.

NO. 5 RD. service operates from Marine and Fraser to Steveston Hwy., and No. 4 Rd., there connecting with service to Brighthouse.

### Routes in Detail

60 RICHMOND EXPRESS—From Sexsmith terminus, Express buses operate across Oak Bridge to Marpole, via Marine, South Granville, Granville Bridge & downtown Granville to Dunsmuir. Buses turn east on Dunsmuir, returning to Sexsmith Terminus via Richards, Granville Bridge, South Granville, Marine & Oak Bridge. Southbound stops in Vancouver at Dunsmuir and Granville, & all regular stops on Richards from Dunsmuir to Drake, then Pacific & Seymour, Granville at 5th, Broadway, 41st, 63rd; Marine, east of Hudson, & 71st and Oak. (Note: When operating in Vancouver, Vancouver-bound buses stop only to let off passengers, and Richmond-bound buses stop only to pick up passengers.)

61 NO. 1 RD.—Sexsmith Terminus via Sexsmith, Cambie, Garden City, Westminster Hwy. & No. 1 to Steveston, looping via Moncton, 2nd, Chatham; returning to Terminus same route.

62 NO. 2 RD.—Sexsmith Terminus via Sexsmith, Cambie, Garden City, Westminster Hwy., No. 3, Blundell, No. 2, Moncton to Steveston, looping via 2nd, Chatham, No. 1, to Moncton; returning to Terminus same route.

63 NO. 3 RD.—Sexsmith Terminus via Sexsmith, Sea Island Hwy. & No. 3, to Williams, looping via Williams, Gilbert & Steveston Hwy.; returning to Terminus via No. 3 & same route.

64 NO. 4 RD.—Sexsmith Terminus via Sexsmith, Sea Island Hwy., No. 3 Granville, No. 4 to Steveston Hwy., looping via Southgate, Berry, Southridge & Steveston Hwy.; returning to Terminus via No. 4 & same route.

65 NO. 5 RD.—From Marine and Fraser via No. 5 and Steveston Hwy. to No. 4, looping via Southgate, Berry, Southridge & Steveston Hwy.; returning to Fraser and Marine same route.

66 RAILWAY—Sexsmith Terminus via Sexsmith, Cambie, Garden City, Granville, Railway, Steveston Hwy. & No. 1, to Steveston, looping via Moncton, 2nd, Chatham & No. 1; returning to Terminus same route.

68 NO. 4 RD. VIA GARDEN CITY—Sexsmith Terminus via Sexsmith, Sea Island Hwy., No. 3, Granville, Garden City, Francis & No. 4 to Steveston Hwy., looping via Southgate, Berry, Southridge, Steveston Hwy., No. 4; returning to Terminus same route.

69 NO. 5 RD.—Cambie—Sexsmith Terminus via Sexsmith, Cambie, No. 5, to Marine & Fraser; returning same route.

71 AIRPORT—Sexsmith Terminus via Sexsmith, Sea Island Hwy., Sea Isl. Bridge & Airport Rd. to Airport; returning to Terminus same route.

72 MILLER—Sexsmith Terminus via Sexsmith, Sea Isl. Hwy., Sea Isl. Bridge or Lulu Isl. Bridge & Airport Rd. (as designated in schedule), then Miller, MacDonald, Grauer, Myron, Ferguson to MacDonald; returning to Terminus same route, either via Sea Isl. Bridge or Lulu Isl. Bridge (as designated in schedule).

74 BRIDGEPORT—Sexsmith Terminus via Sexsmith, Bridgeport, McLennan, Finlayson, No. 4, to Bridgeport; returning to Terminus same route.
