Please deposit your bus fare

If you are not tall enough to reach the fare box, the bus operator will assist by depositing your fare. However our regulations are that you must deposit your own fare unless you are physically unable to do so.

This applies to all cash or token fares, including payment for Vancouver Downtowner pass and the Sunday pass. If you require change, or wish to purchase tokens, the operator will take your money and supply you with change or tokens. However the actual depositing of fares in the fare-box must be done by the passenger.

The only case in which a fare is handed to the operator is in New Westminster where four Shop'n'Ride stamps affixed to a special coupon are accepted as payment for a ride in any single fare zone.

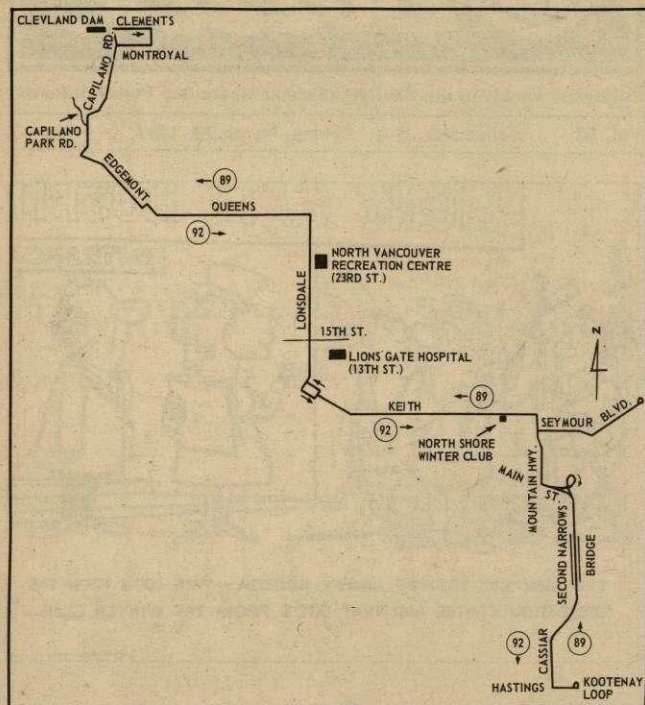
A new bus route

Starting Friday, March 31, there will be a new bus service between Cleveland Dam and Kootenay Loop. This will provide a direct service to Lonsdale Avenue for residents of large residential areas both east and west of Lonsdale. In addition, it provides a new direct service between north Capilano Road, Lonsdale business area and East Hastings Street to Kootenay Loop. It will provide better service for many people to and from North Vancouver Recreational Centre, Lions Gate Hospital and the North Shore Winter Club.

This service should be an interesting route for those who use a Sunday and Holiday Pass

89 Queens — From Kootenay Loop via Hastings, Cassiar, Second Narrows Bridge, Main Street, Mountain Highway, Keith, Lonsdale, Queens, Woodbine, Highland, Edgemont, Capilano to Clements.

92 Keith — From Clements and Capilano via Clements, Cliffridge, Montroyal, Capilano, Edgemont, Highland, Woodbine, Queens, Lonsdale, Keith, Mountain Highway, Main Street, Second Narrows Bridge, Cassiar, Hastings to Kootenay Loop.

Seymour trips from Fern and Mountain Highway via Fern, Seymour Blvd., to Seymour Terminal and return will continue to operate. Consult your new timetable for schedule.

No. 93 Mountain Highway route will continue to operate as at present on a changed schedule.

to travel around Greater Vancouver. Cleveland Dam is its northern terminus. The route passes through lovely residential areas and within walking distance of delightful Capilano Canyon Park which stretches along the Capilano River.

It travels across Queens to Lonsdale and passes North Vancouver's Recreational Centre, then south on Lonsdale to Keith and east to Mountain Highway and then to the Second Narrows Bridge which provides a magnificent view of the harbor. Southern terminus is Kootenay Loop from which direct connections are made into downtown Vancouver and Burnaby.
