
"Broken Pieces" Opens Season

Barnet Fastbus Service

Effective Friday, October 18, the 980 Fastbus Barnet Fastbus service presently operated by Pacific Stage Lines will be taken over by B.C. Hydro's Metro Transit. Changes will be made to frequency of service, the Coquitlam terminus will be moved a short distance, and standard transit fares will come into effect. Too, the exact fare will be required.

The basic daytime service will be improved to provide a 30-minute frequency from Monday to Saturday. On Sundays, there will be 30-minute service from noon to 6 p.m. Otherwise, service will continue on an hourly basis. During rush-hours, there will be additional buses with frequency to 15 minutes during peak periods. Supplemental timetables will be available on PSL buses next week.

In Coquitlam, the terminus will be moved to Wilson Street

near Kingsway adjacent to the Recreation Centre. Recently, the Vancouver terminus was moved around the corner to Hornby on the north side of Nelson.

Effective with takeover by Metro Transit, the interzone fare will be 40¢ from the first bus in the morning to 10 a.m., and from 3 to 7 p.m. Monday to Friday. At all other times, the interzone fare is only 25¢.

However a significant change
