Forty-Ninth 49

Another major cross-city service is now in the final stages of planning and is expected to begin on Friday, March 21. This is Forty-Ninth 49 which will operate between Kingsway at Nelson and the University of British Columbia. The general route is via Imperial, following the diversion to 49th, operating past Champlain Mall, returning to 49th and continuing to Marine Drive, turning at 16th Avenue to Wesbrook and to the East Mall at the University. The complete route with all diversions and all stops is shown on the reverse side of this issue.

Basically, from Monday to Friday, this is approximately a 15-minute service from Kingsway with alternative buses stopping at 41st and Dunbar or going through to the East Mall. This provides basically a 30-minute service to and from the University. First bus leaves Nelson and Kingsway at 5:53 to go

through to the University, leaving there at 7:08. Final departure from Kingsway is 11:35 p.m. and from the University Loop 11:35 p.m.

Timetables will be available and should be obtained as there are minor variations in Departure times from the basic 15-minute schedule. Also, service on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays varies from that supplied on weekdays. Also, while it is expected that the service will commence on March 21, watch the newspapers for any last-minute changes.

This will become a major east-west artery in the Greater Vancouver Transit System. It will be important to those going to Vancouver City College as well as the University of British Columbia. It fills a gap in the trans-city service which has been recognized for some years and has been given careful study before implementation.
