Stage IV – Transit Improvements in Surrey, Delta, and White Rock


I am pleased to announce the fourth stage of our transit improvement programme in Surrey, Delta, and White Rock on October 31st. We will also be expanding our Town and Country BUS services to improve travel opportunities between Vancouver and communities on both the north and south banks of the Fraser Valley.


With the new services, we will be operating fifteen FastBUS routes that link major centres, and fourteen LocalBUS routes that carry passengers to the FastBuses and on short trips within the community. Passenger facilities are being planned for Ladner, Whalley, Guildford, Newton, White Rock, Scottsdale, Tsawwassen, and New Westminster.

Our new FastBUS and LocalBUS system has been two years in the planning process with local citizens and municipal officials working closely with planners of my Bureau of Transit Services and operating specialists in B.C. Hydro. I am hopeful residents will take advantage of the personal mobility opportunities in these new services.

Public transportation is on the move in Surrey, Delta, and White Rock.

A Major Expansion

A major expansion of the transit system, developed to provide comprehensive and efficient transportation for the Lower Mainland area, becomes effective on October 31. New routes will be introduced and changes and additions made to existing routes in the Suburban System serving the area south of the Fraser River. A total of 14 LocalBUS routes and 15 FastBUS routes will serve the area.

In South Delta, there will be two new local routes, 303 and 308, and South Delta Exchange will go into operation at 56th Street and 18th Avenue (the South Delta Recreation Centre grounds) to provide an off-street transfer point for connection between Local and FastBUS services.

In the White Rock area, the 650 FastBUS will be extended to incorporate the present local route 351 North Bluff. This will eliminate the necessity to transfer at Johnston and North Bluff Road.

A rush-hours-only, Monday to Friday service, the 352 Crescent Road, will connect Ocean Park and Elgin, via 128th Street, to Crescent Road providing direct connections with morning and evening FastBUS service to and from the north. On the 355 Russell and 356 Cranley service will

be increased Monday to Friday and Sunday service added.

New Westminster/Vancouver

The eastern part of Canada Way will have a new morning and evening service connecting New Westminster and Downtown Vancouver, the 820 Canada Way. It replaces service now provided by Pacific Stage Lines and will operate Monday to Friday during rush-hours only. Its New Westminster terminus is 8th St. at Columbia and its route is via 8th St., Canada Way, Kensington, Sprott, Highway #1, Cassiar, Hastings, Campbell, Prior, Georgia Viaduct and Dunsmuir to its terminus in the Dunsmuir-Melville connector near Burrard. Stops in Vancouver will be made on Hastings at Cassiar and at Renfrew; then on Dunsmuir from Cambie to Burrard.

To New Westminster it travels via Thurlow, Georgia, Prior, Campbell, Hastings and Cassiar to Highway #1, then Sprott St., Kensington, Canada Way, 8th St., Columbia, Begbie, Front and 8th St. to the terminus.

FastBUS stops will be made along 8th Street and Canada Way at: Columbia, Royal, Queens, 4th, 6th, 8th, 10th, 14th, Edmonds, Imperial, Burrish, Sperling.

Surrey/N. Delta

In the Surrey, Delta, White Rock area, a comprehensive local network of nine routes will be added to the existing services and the upgraded FastBUS system.

The 620 Hjorth FastBUS will now operate between New Westminster and Surrey and has been extended to Cloverdale. It formerly operated out of Vancouver.

The 630 FastBUS will provide daytime service Monday to Saturday from Whalley and Guildford Exchanges to Vancouver and return by way of the Port Mann Bridge and Highway #1.


Connections with Ferry

An important new FastBUS service will connect Langley with the Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal. Route 640 Valley to Sea will travel west by way of Newton, Scottsdale and Ladner Exchanges to provide for the first time an east-west route to transfer Pacific Stage Lines' passengers in Langley and residents of Surrey and Delta to and from the ferry terminal and intermediate

Tsawwassen "Rings"

303 Tsawwassen Ring will provide local service. It will operate from South Delta Exchange alternately clockwise and anti-clockwise except during peak commuter periods when it will operate in the reverse direction to the 603 Tsawwassen Heights FastBUS.

In the clockwise direction the destination sign will read "Tsawwassen Ring 303 out via Beach Grove". Route is from South Delta Exchange via 56th St., 16th Ave., Beach Grove Rd., 12th Ave., 56th St., 1st Ave., English Bluff Road, 12th Ave., 56th St. to Exchange. The counter-clockwise destination sign is "Tsawwassen Ring 303 out via English Bluff". Route is from the Exchange via 56th St., 12th Ave., English Bluff Rd., 1st Ave., 56th St., 12th Ave., Beach Grove Rd., 16th Ave., 56th St. back to the Exchange.

308 Ladner Ring will operate out of the Ladner Exchange. It, too, will run alternately in the clockwise and counter-clockwise directions except during peak traffic periods when it will operate in the reverse direction to the 608 Ladner Ring FastBUS.


PSL Service Changes effective October 30

In the changeover of services, Pacific Stage Lines will withdraw from most but not all local routes in Surrey, Delta and White Rock. The following routes will be continued after Thursday, October 30: Kennedy River Loop, Newton Loop, Endersby Loop, St. Helen's Loop, Archibald-Kindersley Loop, Sandell Loop and White Rock services via King George Highway and via Massey Tunnel.

A new type of transfer-fare receipt will be in use as of October 31st to make identification of origin and destination easier for passengers and operators. When issued such a receipt **do not** be away before disembarking at your destination. Operators are required to charge you the full fare from the previous check-point if you cannot show a receipt on request.

Tours of B.C. Hydro's Peace River power project have returned to winter schedule.

The guided tours will be available between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. Monday through Friday except on statutory holidays when the visitor reception centre will be closed.

During the first eight months of 1975 more than 27,000 people visited the giant power project, about 240 miles north of Prince George. It can be reached via a short drive from the Alaska Highway communities of Dawson Creek and Fort St. John, or from Chetwynd on the Hart Highway.

Nine generating units are in service at the Peace project, which provides more than half the power used by B.C. Hydro's approximately 850,000 electricity customers.


