TIME IN THE MORNING TO SAY GOODBYE TO THE

FAMILY, GEORGE ... WHO'S NEXT? "

Effective Friday, May 30, additional transit services for Surrey, Delta and White Rock will be inaugurated. Planned by the British Columbia Bureau of Transit Services under the transit program of the Honourable James G. Lorimer, Minister of Municipal Affairs, four new FastBUS services will be included in this second stage of the plan for comprehensive bus service for the Surrey-Delta-White Rock area.

Of the new routes, three will connect Surrey to Vancouver by way of the Pattullo Bridge and the fourth will provide North Delta with rush-hour service by way of the Massey Tunnel.

Route 610-North Delta-Deas, the rush-hour service, will operate from 96th Avenue and Scott Road (120th Street), travelling south on 120th Street to Highway 10, to Highway 99,


Kerr and Rupert become one route

over Oak Street Bridge and into downtown Vancouver.

Route 619-Scott, 620-Hiorth and 621-King George are full time services connecting North Surrey with New Westminster, Burnaby and downtown Vancouver. They will also replace the present 820-Canada Way Route.

Surrey Transit Centre

At the same time, Surrey Transit Centre will go into operation at 13329 - 76th Avenue. This new facility initially will have 40 buses and 92 operators, an office staff of six and a maintenance crew of 20, the latter providing service 24 hours a day.

Surrey Transit Centre has 21/2 acres of land for the office and service facilities and for parking area for buses. There is an additional 10 acres for expansion of what eventually will be the operational centre of comprehensive local as well as expanded FastBUS services.

Route 610

Route 610-North Delta Deas: terminal on Hornby at Pender. Travels via Hornby, Hastings and Howe, Granville Bridge, Granville Street, Marine, Hudson, 71st Avenue, Oak Street to Highway 99, to Highway 10 (Ladner Trunk Road), Scott Road (120th Street) to 96th Avenue. The return route is the same except nearing downtown Vancouver buses leave Granville Street Bridge via Seymour Street and Dunsmuir to the terminus.

Buses will only pick up at regular stops in the down-

town area, then at Granville and 5th. Broadway, 41st, 49th, and 63rd, Hudson and Marine, 71st and Oak, then at regular stops for both discharging and picking up.

From Delta, buses will pick up and discharge at all regular stops to Highway 99, then only for discharging at Marine and Osler, and from there the same stops as in the reverse direction.

Departure times are as follows: Monday to Friday; leave Scott and 96th at 6:40, 7:10, 7:40 a.m., to arrive in downtown Vancouver at 7:50, 8:20 and 8:50 a.m.; leave Scottsdale Mall at 3:10, 3:40 and 4:10 p.m. to arrive downtown at 4:00, 4:30 and 5:00 p.m.; leave Vancouver at 7:55, 8:25, 8:55 a.m. to arrive at Scottsdale Mall at 8:50, 9:20 and 9:50 a.m. and at 4:05, 4:35 and 5:05 p.m. to arrive at Scott and 96th at 5:17, 5:47 and 6:17 p.m.

Common Route

The other three services share the same terminus in Vancouver on the Dunsmuir-Melville connector street near Thurlow and follow a common route from there until they cross the Pattullo Bridge. It is via Thurlow, Hastings, Boundary, Douglas, Halifax, Willingdon, Canada Way, 8th Street, Columbia Street, then to the bridge.

The return route from Pattullo Bridge to downtown Vancouver is the same, except that buses turn onto Burrard from Hastings and then to the terminus.

Route 619

619-Scott FastBUS: after crossing the Pattullo Bridge, to Scott Road (120th Street). 70th Avenue and Nicholson to the terminus at 70th Avenue (Scottsdale Centre). From Scottsdale, buses travel to Vancouver via Nicholson, 72nd Avenue, Scott Road, 110th Avenue, 128th Street, King George Highway and Pattullo Bridge, then McBride Boulevard. Columbia Street, 8th Street, Canada Way and to Vancouver.

Frequency of service is basically every 30 minutes Monday to Friday, with additional service in rush-hours and less frequent service on weekends.

Route 620

620-Hjorth FastBUS: after crossing the Pattullo Bridge, King George Highway, 102nd Avenue, 135th Street (Whalley Exchange), 104th Avenue, 150th Street, service road on the north side of Eaton's parking lot, 152nd Street, 104th Avenue to terminus adiacent to Guildford Shopping Centre.

Returning to Vancouver buses travel on 104th Avenue, King George Highway, 102nd Avenue, 135th Street (Whalley Exchange), 104th Avenue, King George Highway, then the bridge, and follow the same route as 619 and 621.

Frequency of service is basically every 30 minutes Monday to Friday, with additional rush-hour service and less frequent service on weekends.

Route 621

621-King George FastBUS: from Pattullo Bridge southbound, via King George Highway, 104th Avenue, 135th

Street (Whalley Exchange), 102nd Avenue, King George Highway, 152nd Street (Johnston Road). Thrift Avenue, Foster Street, North Bluff Road to terminus in front of the Central Plaza Shopp Centre in White Rock.

The return route is via North Bluff Road, 152nd Street, then the King George Highway and follow the same route as south.

However certain trips will operate between Vancouver and Newton only. These will run from Whalley Exchange via 135th Street, 102nd Avenue, King George Highway, 72nd Avenue, special access road adjacent to the library to terminus on 136B Street (Newton Exchange), then return via 136B Street, 72nd Avenue and King George High-

Frequency between Vancouver and White Rock is basically every hour. Between Newton Exchange and Vancouver it is basically every 30 minutes with greater frequency during rush hours and fewer trips on weekends.

Timetables & Stops

Timetables for all the routes will be available before their effective date and will be distributed widely throughout the area affected.

For the three routes serving Surrey, outbound buses will pick up at all appropriately signed stops within the downtown area, then pick up only on Hastings at Renfrew and at Kootenay, at Halifax and Willingdon and at Canada Way and Willingdon, then for loading or unloading at Canada Way and Ledger (Burnaby Municipal Hall), Canada Way and Ed-

Suburban-Type Buses for Delta-Surrey-White Rock

Brand new buses will go into operation with the introduction of the four new routes serving the Delta and Surrey areas. They will be the Fast-BUS type, most with bucket seats and a few with reclinertype seating. All are radioequipped for two-way communication with the transit centre. All have new-type fare boxes which will accept onedallar bills, although they do hake change.

monds, 8th Street and 6th Avenue and 8th and Columbia. Then buses will stop at all regular stops to their termini in Surrey or White Rock.

The same procedure will be followed on inbound trips.

With the introduction of service from Vancouver into Delta and Surrey, a new fare structure became effective. Present fares in the Greater Vancouver area (four zones) are unchanged. However the following fares apply to the total transit system:

ADULT Regular 25¢ for first zone 15¢ for second zone 20d for each additional zone Off-Peak (1) 25¢ for first two zones



FastBUS Terminus Relocation Downtown

Due to traffic changes brought about by the forthcoming closure of Robson Street between Howe and Hornby, the following revisions will take effect Monday, May 26th, 1975.

The 714-Berkley, 910-

Mountain Highway and 911-Seymour will operate via regular route to Burrard and Robson then via Robson. Thurlow to terminus located on the Haro-Smithe Connector, Return trips to North Vancouver will operate via the Connector. northbound on Burrard and regular route beyond.

The 933-Lougheed and 980-Barnet will operate on regular route via Burrard to Nelson to new terminus on Nelson west of Hornby. Return trips to Coquitlam will operate via Hornby, Robson, Burrard and regular route 6 beyond.
