#### Hastings Street

An augmented service is operating on the 14-Hastings route between downtown Vancouver and the PNE grounds.

#### New Westminster

From 8th Street and Columbia, service via Columbia, 12th Street, Kingsway, Earles, Renfrew to the Coliseum loop. Regular fares apply. These buses are signed "New Westminster – PNE via Kingsway – Renfrew".

#### Lougheed Mall

Service from Lougheed Mall via Austin, Lougheed, Willingdon, Halifax, Douglas, Boundary, Hastings, Renfrew to the Coliseum loop. Again, regular fares and transfers will apply. These buses are signed "Lougheed Mall – PNE only".

#### PNE Express via Broadway

Service along Broadway for PNE patrons, offering passengers from the southern areas of the city a more convenient trip to and from the Fair. It runs from Broadway and Granville and the PNE grounds via Broadway and Renfrew.

The service is on an express basis and stopping only at transfer points. Buses carry the sign "PNE EXPRESS VIA BROADWAY" and regular



The Buzzer of August 29 will contain full details of the routes which go into service on September 2.


