

False Creek service starts

With the opening of the first stage of redevelopment of the south side of False Creek in Vancouver, B.C. Hydro Transit will begin half-hour bus service November 26 to link the area to Broadway and downtown.

False Creek South 50 will start from Willow at Broadway, via Willow to 6th Ave., to Heather Square and Sitka Square in the new False Creek area, back to the foot of Oak and then along 6th Ave. to Granville Bridge, down Granville Street to Cordova.

The south-bound trip is from Cordova at Granville, via Cordova to Richards, south to Hastings and back to Granville, south on Granville and over the bridge, off via the 4th Ave. ramp to 6th Ave., east along 6th to Oak to turn into the new area, stopping at Sitka Square and Heather Square, back to 6th Ave., to Cambie, south to Broadway and return to Willow.
