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May means improvements for transit

May 13 is the day when many B.C. Hydro Transit service improvements take effect.

In North Vancouver, rush hour service on the Queens 89 bus will double. Buses between 15th and Lonsdale and Kootenay Loop will travel at a frequency of every 15 minutes, instead of every half-hour.

From New Westminster, there will be three new Sunday morning buses from Eighth and Columbia to Surrey and Langley. Earliest Sunday departures will be 8:15 a.m. for the Hjorth 620 to Langley, 8:32 a.m. for the Scott 619 to Scottsdale Mall and 8:45 a.m. for the King George 621 bus to White Rock.

Also in White Rock, the Crescent Road 652 bus service will depart from Johnson and North Bluff at 6:10, 6:40 and 7:10 a.m. to provide an easier connection at Crescent Road and 128th Street with the 650 bus. Afternoon departure times of the 652 bus from Hornby and Pender will be advanced five minutes to 4:10, 4:40 and 5:10 p.m. for the convenience of White Rock-bound passengers.

At the same time the Marine Drive 653 bus service will depart two minutes earlier, to permit better connections at

Johnson and North Bluff with the King George bus. Late afternoon departure times from Hornby and Pender also have been adjusted to permit easier transferring for White Rock patrons.

Meanwhile a change in routing is planned for the Clarke 181, Ioco 189 and Dewdney 190 bus runs to serve residents of Port Moody better. In each case the service has been extended beyond College Parkway to include Washington and Princeton Streets in this growing residential area.

The 601, 602, 603, 608, 650, 652 and 653 buses will be rerouted, as well, and will travel via Hornby, Pender and Howe rather than Hornby, Hastings and Howe. This change will eliminate the delays now being encountered on Hastings Street during rush hours.

Transfer privileges make it easier for all of us to around.

We can connect with relative ease from one bus route to another without the costly and awkward hassle of continually looking for additional fares.

But like everything else, there is a right way and a wrong way to use transfers. So, here are a few pointers to help you as passengers use transfers properly, which in turn, helps your operators do their job more efficiently.

Ask for a transfer when you pay your fare. Asking your driver for a transfer while the bus is in motion could distract the operators attention from the road.

Transfer only at regular transfer points. Operators are not permitted to accept transfers at non-transfer points.

When two routes intersect, the transfer point is at the stop closest to the intersection where the routes cross. Do not walk beyond this point, or your transfer will not be accepted.

When two routes meet, travel over the same street and then part, there are several transfer points: at the intersection where the routes first come together, at the first common stop, and at the intersection where the routes part.

When two routes cross, travel parallel to each other within two blocks and finally meet again, the transfer point is at the intersection where they first cross or where they finally meet, not part-way in between.

When transferring, you must take the first connect bus. There are no stop-over privileges on a transfer.
