

New routes, and other improvements October 28th

Several significant improvements in the transit system are coming with regular quarterly service changes Oct. 28.

The 10 Tenth-UBC route will be extended west from University Loop after 7 p.m. seven days per week to serve the Place Vanier and Totem Park student residences and encourage greater use of the transit system during evenings by students living on the campus.

In Surrey, a new route called 335 Bridgeview will be introduced to serve the Sunbury/River Road/Bridgeview/Port Mann area mid-days Monday through Saturday. Buses will travel from Scottsdale Mall via Scott Rd., 84th Ave., River Rd., Scott Rd., 110th Ave., 128th St., then via the Port Mann-Bridgeview area to Guildford Exchange. Service leaves Scottsdale Mall at 9:33 a.m., 11:33 a.m. and 1:33 p.m. and Guildford Exchange at 10:41 a.m., 12:41 p.m. and 2:41 p.m. This route replaces service in the Port Mann/Bridgeview area which will be discontinued by Pacific Stage Lines.

In Port Moody, the route of the 189 Ioco has been altered to serve the new residential area along Washington Drive. The 181 Clarke and 190 Dewdney will continue to serve College Park.

In North Vancouver, the 246 Highland schedule has been adjusted Monday through Saturday during the day to provide better connections with the 232 Queens at the Village in Cap Highlands.

VANCOUVER CHANGES

Coinciding with the re-opening of Robson Street in downtown between Howe and Hornby Streets, the 6 Fraser will be re-routed via Robson, Burrard and Pender instead of Robson, Granville and Pender. The 15 Cambie will be rerouted via Pender, Burrard and Robson instead of Pender, Granville and Robson.

The 5 Robson route has been modified to operate via Pender, Granville and Robson instead of Pender, Burrard and Robson. The 19 Kingsway route has similarly been modified to operate via Robson, Granville and Pender instead of Robson, Thurlow, Smithe, Burrard and Pender.

There will be minor schedule revisions on the Main/Robson and Davie/Kingsway routes. Changes in the 5 Robson and 19 Kingsway downtown routings along Granville are contemplated for implementation on Sunday, Oct. 30, provided all overhead wiring has been completed by that time. Should there be any further delay notices will be posted along that part of the route so affected.

These changes have been developed in conjunction with the City of Vancouver to serve the majority of riders.

To permit some of these significant improvements, reductions in the "owl" network of service in the city of Vancouver routes will take place after 1:10 a.m., when extensive ridership surveys have indicated very few patrons are riding the buses.

Only alternate routes are affected so it will still be possible for passengers to catch buses from downtown as late as 3:10 a.m. though they could face a longer walk home at the end of their ride.

Continuing to 3:10 a.m. are the following routes: 6 Fraser, 8 Davie (returning via Robson), 9 Broadway, 10 Tenth-UBC, 14 Hastings, 15 Cambie, 16 Renfrew, 19 Kingsway, 20 Granville, 22 Macdonald (returning via 41st, Dunbar and Broadway), and 25 Victoria.

Last departures from downtown will take place at 1:10 a.m. on the following routes: 1 Beach (no change from current schedule), 3 Main, 4 Fourth, 5 Robson (use 8 Davie after 1:10 a.m.), 7 Dunbar (use 22 Macdonald after 1:10 a.m.), 11 Stanley Park, 12 Powell (no change from current schedule), 17 Oak, 18 Arbutus, 22 Knight and 24 Nanaimo. For 12 Powell and 16 Renfrew after 1:10 a.m. use 14 Hastings to Hastings and Nanaimo and transfer to Renfrew shuttle. This will continue to provide service from downtown Vancouver until 3:10 a.m. on these routes.

The 41 Forty-first will be timed to connect with the last 1:10 a.m. buses from downtown. There is no change to the 49 Forty-ninth schedule, which currently ends before 0 a.m.

All B.C. Hydro Transit timetables, with the exception of the 20 Granville/25 Victoria, are being reprinted for the October 28 service changes. North Vancouver timetables will be put into two convenient booklets — Eastern and Western North Vancouver.

The new timetables will be available at the usual community outlets by Oct. 24.

The Pacific Stage Lines Fraser Valley North & South Side timetables are also being reprinted for Oct. 28.

49 FORTY-NINTH AVENUE CORRECTION

SPECIAL BUS SERVICE TO NHL GAMES

B.C. Hydro will operate on special routes to provide a fast direct service to all National Hockey League games at Coliseum. The service will originate from Lougheed Mall urnaby, from the corner of 8th St. and 6th Ave. in New Westminster, from Edgemont and Highland in North Vancouver. In Vancouver two routes will operate; one from 41st & Oak and the other from Fir & Broadway.

Buses from Lougheed Mall will pick up and discharge passengers at all FastBUS stops. They travel via Austin, Lougheed, Willingdon and Hastings. From New Westminster, they will pick up at all regular stops along Kingsway to Boundary, then express to the Coliseum. On the return trip, buses will travel non-stop to Boundary and Kingsway and then drop off passengers at all regular stops.

The North Vancouver service picks up and discharges passengers at Edgemont and Highland and at all other regular transfer points. This service does not operate for Sunday games.

The Hastings Special leaves 41st & Oak travelling via 41st Ave., Granville and Hastings to the Coliseum picking up at all regular stops as far as Main St., then only at Commercial and Nanaimo.

The Broadway Special originates at Fir St. on Broadway picking up at Fir, Granville, Oak, Cambie, Main, Kingsway, Fraser, Clark, Commercial, Nanaimo and Renfrew.
