For its initial plunge, the Association has hooked up with the United Cerebral Palsy Association in its telethon to be aired on KOMO TV Channel 4, Seattle, January 12 at 8 p.m. continuing through to 6 p.m. on January 13. Canadian viewers will be able to phone their donations into the Vancouver pledge centre. Donations will then be registered on the Canadian board at the Seattle telethon centre.

All funds raised from B.C. will go to the Cerebral Palsy Association of B.C. and used for facilities for the neurologically handicapped in this province. What's more, all donations are tax-deductible and contributors will receive Canadian income tax receipts.

The KOMO TV telethon, judging from the lineup of talent that's scheduled for the 22 hours of air time is sure to keep the viewers tuned in and the pledges rolling. Hosting the show will be John Ritter of Three's Company fame, Canadian Paul Anka and Dennis James. The guests to enliven the proceedings include Bob Hope, Henry Winkler (The Fonz) and Donny and Marie Osmond.

## **INCREASED SERVICE ON SOME ROUTES**

To meet increased demands, additional trips have been added to some routes in the North Vancouver, Surrey, Coquitlam/Port Coquitlam areas during rush hour periods.

In North Vancouver, the 246 Highland service to Vancouver has an extra trip leaving Marine & Bewicke at 7:02 a.m., while an additional 240 Marine Drive run to Vancouver leaves Lonsdale & 15th at 7:44 a.m.

The 601 South Delta service has an additional trip leaving Hornby & Nelson to Ladner Exchange at 3:28 p.m. The 351 North Bluff service also has an added trip that leaves Hornby & Pender at 2:45 p.m.

Additional trips have also been added to the 151 Laurentian and 160 Barnet services. The 151 Laurentian has two morning departures from Port Coquitlam City Hall at 6:26 and 6:56 a.m. In the evening additional 151 trips depart Hornby & Nelson at 4:04 and 4:25 p.m. Also the 160 Barnet adds a trip which leaves Port Coquitlam City Hall at 6:53 a.m. as well as two evening departures from Hornby & Nelson at 4:07 and 4:45 p.m.

## **HOCKEY EXPRESS SERVICE**

B.C. Hydro Transit offers fast direct service to all National Hockey League games at the Coliseum.

An hour before game time, buses will leave Broadway and Granville with a "Coliseum" destination sign. Approximately at the same time from New Westminster, a bus leaves 8th & 6th, also with a Coliseum destination sign. A bus will also leave Edgemont and Ridgewood in North Vancouver 1 hour and 15 minutes before game time. In Port Coquitlam, one bus will leave City Hall 1 hour and 45 minutes before game time while another will leave 1 hour and 35 minutes before the game. Regular fares will apply.

## **STOPOVER PRIVILEGE FOR TAXPAYERS**

The first 1980 due date for payment of City of Vancouver taxes is February 5. To accommodate taxpayers, B.C. Hydro will once again grant stopover privileges to anyone who would like to get off at City Hall, pay their taxes, and continue their journey.

This concession does not permit taxpayers to go to City Hall and then make a return journey. Ask the transit operator for a transfer when you board your bus. This will allow a one-hour stopover. The transfer must be stamped at the City Treasurer's Department at City Hall to be valid for continuation of the journey.

This special privilege will be in effect through to February 5. A similar concession will be available when the second tax payment becomes due.

## **CHINATOWN BEAUTIFICATION**

It is expected that minor route changes will become effective Sunday, January 27 in the Chinatown area due to the closure of the Pender-Keefer Diversion. Routes affected are: 6 Fraser, 19 Kingsway, 22 Knight, 54 Stride, 55 Twelfth Street, 96 Sixth Street and the Shopper's Freebus.

## **NOTICE TO 163 PRAIRIE PATRONS**

The detour route established some weeks ago on the 163 Prairie service in the area of Chelsea & Inverness Streets, Port Coquitlam, is now a permanent route change.

Westbound, the route is from the terminus at Chelsea & Cedar Drive via Chelsea, Inverness, Essex, Cedar Drive and follows the regular route beyond.

There is no change in the eastbound portion of this service.
