# Beach Service connects West End, Burrard, Seabus and Gastown 

The 1 BEACH service is mighty handy for getting around downtown business and shopping areas and for connecting with SeaBus. From the terminus on Powell at Columbia, it travels along Powell, Water, Cordova, (picks up SeaBus passengers), Granville, Hastings, Burrard (Burrard business section), Davie (through West End), Denman, Beach, Hornby, Drake, Burrard, Hastings, Granville, Cordova, (SeaBus and Gastown), Columbia to Powell.

If you haven't travelled to or from SeaBus recently, 1 BEACH has replaced 81 SEABUS BURRARD as the connection between SeaBus and the Burrard Street business area.

## Art Rentals

Patrons of the Vancouver Art Gallery's Art Rental Programme will now have three opportunities per month to rent original works of art for their homes, offices and apartments. Previously relegated to daytime hours on the first Wednesday of the month, the service, beginning this month will be available as follows: from 1 to 4 pm on the first Sunday of the month; from 10 am to 3 pm on the first Wednesday of the month and from 3 to 8 pm on the second Wednesday of the month.

Four hundred paintings and prints from the studios of artists of local, national and international reputation are currently on the Art Rental roster with some thirty additional pieces added monthly to meet the increasing demand for new works. Rental fees are nominal, ranging from $\$ 4$ to a maximum of $\$ 15$ per month.

Although the Programme is restricted to members of the Vancouver Art Gallery, interested individuals and corporations are welcome to apply for membership on any Art Rental day.
