... We're Working on a Problem

We are working on new bus designs more suited to the habits of some of our passengers. The first is a simple interior change. Immediately behind the operator, and on both sides of the bus, there will be sentry boxes. We originally planned to use scimitar-armed Nubian slaves in these boxes, but it seems that nowadays all Nubians are busy writing thesis for their doctorate degrees and are not looking for slave jobs. Consequently, we will use hawk-faced chaperons as there appears to be an unemployment problem in the chaperon area.

The chaperons will use elephant goads to urge passengers to the rear of the bus.

The other design we are working on is more complex and will take time to develop. It consists of a bus eight feet long but forty feet high. There will be five operators, one at each of five levels, and everyone on the bus can crowd around an operator and look through the windshield. However this model keeps falling over and our research department is trying to find out why.

In the meantime, all our passengers can assist greatly by moving to the rear of the bus. At this time of year, pass-ups often mean leaving people standing in the rain and cold. A small group of passengers can block the area behind the operator who frequently cannot tell whether his bus is full. Too, our operators do become frustrated from asking people to move to the rear.

So please be a co-operative bus passenger. Do not plug the entrance area. Move to the rear as soon as you have paid your fare.


