Transit service changes effective December 17th

Check a new timetable for full information.

EARLY EVENING SERVICE will be reduced on the following routes: 9 BROADWAY, 3 MAIN-5 ROBSON, 6 FRASER-8 DAVIE, 15 CAMBIE-19 KINGSWAY, 20 GRANVILLE-21 VICTORIA, 49 FORTY-NINTH, 820 CANADA WAY.

4 FOURTH-17 OAK - Monday to Friday daytime frequency will be reduced from 12 to 15 minutes.

9 BROADWAY - Minor adjustments in daytime service, and adjustments in evening service up to 11 p.m.

10 10TH-UBC - With 25 KING EDWARD providing service to UBC, 10 10TH-UBC peak-hour service will be reduced.

20 GRANVILLE-21 VICTORIA - With the introduction of the 25 KING EDWARD route, the VICTORIA route number will become "21".

27 RUPERT - Rush-hour frequency will end earlier in the morning and begin later in the afternoon.

28 SMITH - The route will be revised in the area of Burnaby General Hospital. It will revert to the former routing via Smith, Kincaid, Ingleton, Sunset, Smith in both directions.

41 FORTY-FIRST - Monday to Friday daytime frequency on the 41st Avenue route east of Joyce Loop and west of Camosun will be 20 minutes; between Joyce and Camosun, 10 minutes. With 49 FORTY-NINTH and 25 KING EDWARD providing additional service to UBC, 41 FORTY-FIRST peak-hour service to UBC will be reduced.

49 FORTY-NINTH - All A.M. and P.M. rush-hour trips will be extended to UBC. On Sundays and holidays, service will commence earlier and finish later.

54 STRIDE - Frequency for Monday to Friday daytime service (9 a.m.-3:30 p.m.) will be 30 minutes. Frequency all day Saturday will be 30 minutes.

95 QUEENSBORO-99 SECOND STREET - Service will return on a limited basis to the east end of Queensboro via Ewen, Mercer, Blackley, Duncan, Furness, Ewen.

640 VALLEY-TO-SEA - Leave times will be adjusted.

King Edward XXV is your new cross-town bus between Burnaby and UBC. It will operate from Brentwood Mall at Halifax and Willingdon in Burnaby and will run along Willingdon, Sanderson Way, Kincaid, Boundary, East 22nd Avenue, Nanaimo, Kingsway, King Edward, Dunbar, West 16th Avenue and Blanca to Blanca Loop.

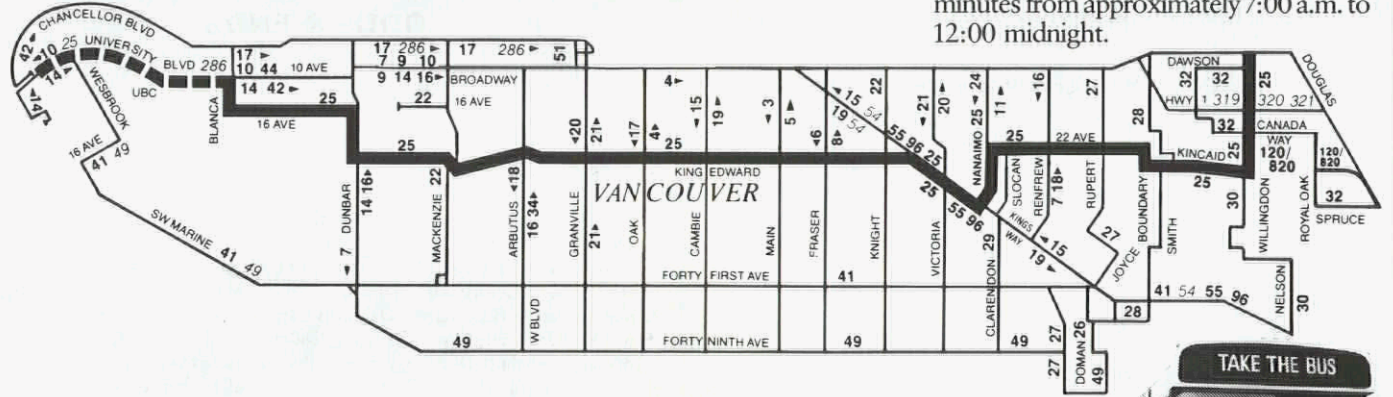
When UBC is in session, the 25 King Edward service will extend beyond the Blanca Loop into the university campus. It will run from 7:30 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. and from 2:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, via Blanca and University Boulevard.

Here are the times for the regular 25 King Edward Route.

Monday to Friday. Every 15 minutes from approximately 6:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. and every 30 minutes from 6:30 p.m. to 12:00 midnight.

Saturdays. Every 15 minutes from approximately 7:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. and every 30 minutes from 6:30 p.m. to 12:00 midnight.

Sundays and Holidays. Every 30 minutes from approximately 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight.
