



Boarding and alighting at multi-bus zones

At bus zones designed to accommodate two or more buses, uncontrolled boarding and alighting may lead to accidents. Metro Transit has therefore laid down procedures so that passengers will know what to expect and what to do.

- The first two buses in the zone will allow passengers to board or alight.
- Any following buses will allow passengers to alight if the operators decide that their vehicles are in safe positions, but passengers may not board.

Passengers waiting to board are asked to wait until their bus reaches one of the first two positions in the zone.

Metro Transit Operators set new safety record

While British Columbia road accident rates have been making the national news, Metro Transit operators have been bucking the trend.

Figures just released for 1981 show that the number of incidents per million bus miles travelled was 59.7 — 2.6% fewer than in 1980 — 42% fewer than in 1975.

Of the six Metro Transit Operating Centres, North Vancouver showed the greatest decrease and won the Metro Transit Safe Driving Award for 1981. Victoria was second. North Vancouver's rate was down 23.3% from 1980 and 58% from 1975.

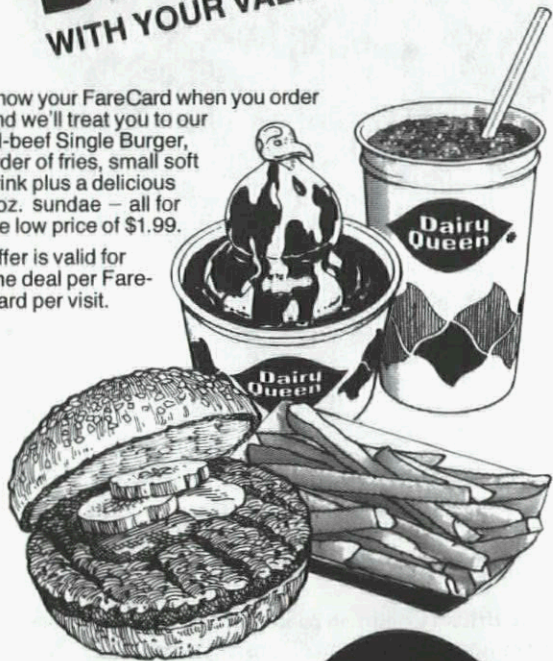
Metro Transit operators have also received recognition from their peers. They recently won the Canadian Urban Transit Award for the greatest improvement in safety across Canada. This was followed by the American Public Transit Award for all of North America.

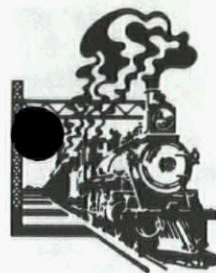
