

If you're under 21 and attending school, up to and including Grade 12, you're entitled to travel on M.T.O.C. buses for less than half the adult fare.

However, each time you pay this reduced fare you must show that you're qualified by producing a personalized **GoCard School Certificate**. Without the certificate you will be charged the full adult fare.

So get your GoCard soon and take good care of it. Since the saving it offers over the school year is considerable, a GoCard is **not transferable** and if lost will cost \$5 to replace.
