NEW SIGNS COMING YOUR WAY

We're making some changes in transit vehicle destination signs in Vancouver, Richmond, Surrey and White Rock. About 180 new signs are being phased in as old ones need replacing. As well as being easier to read, the description on various routes will change to emphasize the destination of the route. Some numbers will also change to make identification clearer.

For instance, the 401 NO. ONE ROAD heading into Vancouver will now be called 401 VANCOUVER. When it returns to Richmond, it will be called 401 ONE ROAD. The 407 GILBERT will now read 407 VANCOUVER during the morning peak period. In the off peak, when travelling to Cook and 3rd the sign will read 407 RICHMOND EXCHANGE, and 407 GILBERT when travelling to Chatham and 2nd.


Some route numbers will change so that the number stays the same in either direction, and only the description changes, to indicate where the bus is headed.

Take a bus to UBC and join a free walking tour

For out-of-town visitors and residents alike, the University of British Columbia can offer lots to see and do during the summer.

For instance, walking tours are available daily at 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., Monday through Friday. Tours can be arranged by calling 228-3131. A day's notice is requested.

Some of the attractions generally included in the tours are the UBC Aquatic Centre (also open for public swimming), Nitobe Garden and other areas of the Botanical Garden, the Main Library and Sedgewick underground library, and the Geology Museum.

Tours of the Dairy Cattle Research and Teaching Unit are also available. Dairy milking takes place at 2 p.m. and 3 p.m. Call 228-4593 to book a tour.

Another nearby attraction is the fabulous Museum of Anthropology, on Northwest Marine Drive.
