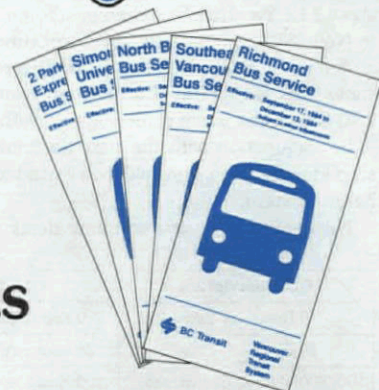

Burnaby and New Westminster New Destination Signs

Installation of new destination signs is now underway and will be completed in the next few months.

Descriptions or numbers on various routes are being changed to make identification clearer. For instance, **55 Twelfth Street** will show **112 Twelfth St.** when eastbound from downtown Vancouver to New Westminster and **112 Vancouver** on the return trip.

A further example is the **30 Willingdon** which will be revised to show **130 Kootenay Loop** when travelling northbound and then **130 Suncrest** when returning to South Burnaby.

In conjunction with the new destination signs, the on-street bus stop identification signs will be revised to reflect the new route numbering system.
