Cambie Bridge Closure

New routes for 15 Cambie

17 Oak

11 Stanley Park / 19 Kingsway

Starting Sunday, November 18

New public timetables for these routes will be issued during the week of November 12.

Cambie and Oak Riders

Closure of the Cambie Street Bridge will require re-direction of the 15 Cambie and 17 Oak services for approximately one year. (cont'd.)

Instead of crossing the Cambie Street Bridge, these two services will be rerouted across the Granville Bridge using diesel buses. Schedules will remain the same. We hope the inconvenience caused will be as little as possible.

New Destination Signs

Outbound buses will continue to show **15 Cambie** and **17 Oak**, but Cambie buses heading downtown will show **15 to Downtown only** and Oak buses heading downtown will show **17 to Downtown only**.

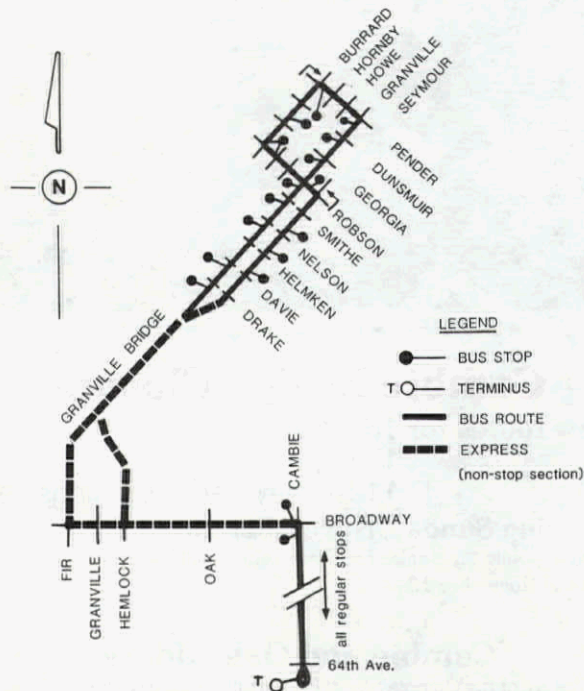
Express on Broadway

To speed up service to and from the downtown core, both services will operate non-stop on a portion of their routes.

The **15 Cambie/15 to Downtown only** will operate non-stop between Cambie at Broadway and downtown.

The **17 Oak/17 to Downtown only** will operate non-stop between Oak at Broadway and downtown.

15 Cambie / 15 to Downtown only

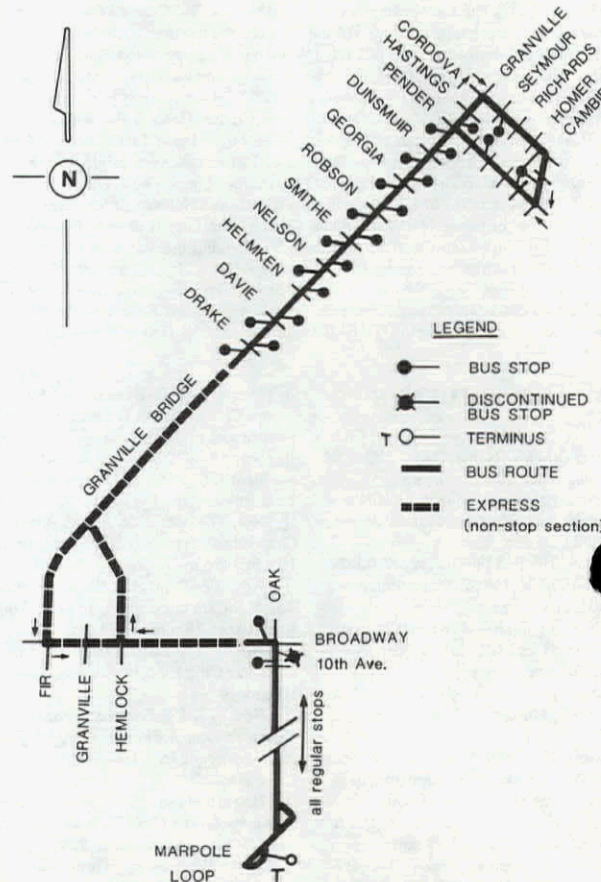


Stanley Park and Kingsway Riders

Conversion of the 15 Cambie and 17 Oak services from trolley to diesel buses will affect the **11 Stanley Park** and **19 Kingsway** routes.

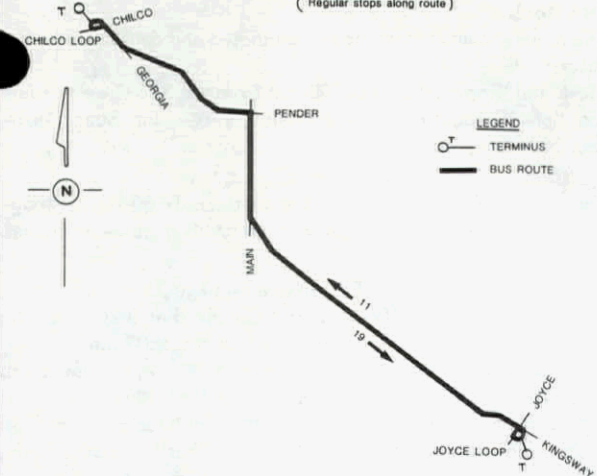
These two trolley services will run as a single service starting November 18, with no reduction in downtown coverage. In fact, the Stanley Park service will be improved.

Fine or jail term for assaulting operator

A man charged with assaulting a North Vancouver operator pleaded guilty and was given a choice of paying \$500 or spending 14 days in jail. In addition, the judge placed him on 2 years probation, ordered him to apologize personally to the operator and directed him to perform 200 hours of community service in the following 6 months.
