# SUBURBAN TRANSIT SERVICE REVISIONS MARCH 22

Plans to improve rush hour bus service to and from downtown Vancouver on the Barnet Highway corridor and through the Massey Tunnel-Highway 99 corridor have been approved by the Vancouver Regional Transit Commission and will be implemented March 22.

The changes, the first phase of the 1985-86 service plan, focus on three areas: Coquitlam-Port Coquitlam, White Rock-South Surrey and Ladner-South Delta.

White Rock-South Surrey revisions were featured in the March 1 issue of The Buzzer.

#### Coquitlam/Port Coquitlam/Port Moody

Transit service in this area is being changed. We're adding buses on some routes and increasing convenience on others by eliminating the need to transfer to reach downtown Vancouver.

And we're providing service to new areas - Eagle Ridge, River Springs and Victoria Drive.

We're also making routes more efficient by providing service that reflects passenger demand.

#### **New Service**

The following new services have been designed to make commuting more convenient.

160 Barnet The #160 Barnet is being extended to provide service to the Eagle Ridge neighbourhood and Eagle Ridge Hospital, as well as the area




