

Transit Service Changes effective Friday, January 3, 1986

15 Cambie/Downtown

The #15 service will be rerouted in downtown Vancouver. The existing downtown loop will be replaced by a combined 15 Cambie/17 Oak route which provides a two-way service along Robson, Burrard, Pender to Hamilton. The mid-day frequency will be changed to every 12 minutes (from every 10 minutes) while the evening service will operate every 20 minutes (from every 15 minutes)

17 Oak/Downtown

The #17 service will be rerouted via the new Cambie Street Bridge. From Oak and Broadway to downtown the route will operate via Broadway, Cambie, Cambie Bridge, Smythe, Hamilton, Pender, Burrard, Robson to Granville (then continue as 15 Cambie). Outbound the #17 route is from Robson at Granville via Robson, Burrard, Pender, Cambie, Nelson, Cambie Bridge, Cambie, Broadway to Oak. Mid-day frequencies will be improved to every 12 minutes (from every 15 minutes).

25 Brentwood/Blanca (UBC peak hours)

The #25 route will connect with the SkyTrain at Nanaimo Station. in both directions. During evenings and Sundays departure times have been adjusted slightly.

27 Kootenay Loop/Champlain Heights

The #27 route will connect with the SkyTrain at Joyce Station. in both directions.

29 29th Avenue Station/Elliott

The #29 route will be extended from Kingsway & Slocan via Slocan, 29th Avenue to the 29th Avenue Station in order to provide a SkyTrain connection. The PM peak frequency will be changed to every 15 minutes (from every 12 minutes). Northbound buses will now display "29-29th Avenue Station" on destination signs.

41 Metrotown Station/UBC

The portion of the existing #41 route operating into Burnaby will be terminated at the Metrotown Station. The route will be via Joyce, Kingsway, Willingdon, Central Blvd. to Metrotown Station.

Eastbound 41 trips to Burnaby will display "41-Metrotown Station" on destination signs.

49 Burnaby South/UBC

The peak period frequency Monday through Friday will. improved to every 12 minutes (from every 15 minutes) in or to alleviate overcrowding.

100 Port Coguitlam Centre/ New Westminster Station/Airport

The #100 route will be rerouted to serve both the 22nd Street and New Westminster SkyTrain Stations. West of 22nd Street Station every 2nd trip will operate via Trapp and Willard replacing the existing 108 service. Alternate trips on the #100 route will continue to operate via Marine Drive between 7th Avenue and Willard. In addition the section of route beyond 8th and Columbia to Queens and 6th Street in uptown New Westminster will be discontinued. These trips will now terminate at New Westminster Station

102 Lougheed Mall/Annacis Island/ Queensboro

The #102 route will be rerouted in downtown New Westminster via New Westminster Station in order to provide a SkyTrain connection.

106 New Westminster Station/Vancouver

The #106 route will be terminated at New Westminster Station thus providing a SkyTrain connection. Eastbound buses will now display "106-New Westminster Station" on destination signs.

108 Cumberland/Elliott/22nd Street Station

The western terminus for all trips will be changed to 22nd Street Station with buses operating via 8th Avenue, 23rd Street, 7 Avenue to the Station. Service formerly provided to the Will and Trapp area will now be provided by the #100 route. addition the #108 route will operate via New Westminster Station in order to provide a SkyTrain connection. Westbound buses will now display "108-22nd Street Station" on destination signs.

112 New Westminster Station/Vancouver

The #112 route will be terminated at New Westminster Station thus providing a SkyTrain connection. Eastbound buses will now display "112-New Westminster Station" on destination signs.

114 Edmonds Loop/Burnaby South

The #114 route will be operated via the Edmonds Station (19th Street at 18th Avenue) in order to provide a SkyTrain connection.

120 New Westminster Station/Vancouver

The #120 route will be terminated at New Westminster Station thus providing a SkyTrain connection. Eastbound buses will now display "120-New Westminster Station" on destination signs.

0 Suncrest/Kootenay Loop

The #130 route will be operated via Metrotown Station thus providing a SkyTrain connection. Southbound the route from Kingsway and Nelson will be via Kingsway, McKay, Central Blvd., Metrotown Station, Central Blvd., Willingdon, Maywood and regular route. Northbound buses operate from Willingdon and Maywood via Willingdon, Central Blvd., Metrotown Station, Central Blvd., McKay, Kingsway, Nelson and regular route.

131 and 132 Edmonds Station/ Kootenay Loop

The #131 and #132 routes will be extended from Edmonds Loop via Edmonds and 19th Street to Edmonds Station. Buses will no longer operate into Edmonds Loop but will now stop in front of the loop on Edmonds. Eastbound #131 and #132 buses will now display "Edmonds Station" on destination signs.

In addition, the eastbound #132 route will be changed to operate via Gilmore and Canada Way instead of Gilmore, Manor, Sumner, Canada Way. There is no change to the westbound routing.

135 SFU/Kootenay Loop

One additional trip will be operated via Discovery Park during the PM peak.

142 SFU/Edmonds Station

The #142 route will be extended from Edmonds Loop via Edmonds and 19th Street to Edmonds Station. Buses will no longer operate into Edmonds Loop but will now stop in front of pop on Edmonds. Southbound buses will now display "142nonds Station" on destination signs.

145 Lougheed Mall/SFU

Four trips during the PM peak will be operated via Discovery Park.

147 Coguitlam Centre/ **New Westminster Station**

148 loco/New Westminster Station

The #147 and #148 routes will be terminated at New Westminster Station in order to provide a SkyTrain connection. Westbound buses will now display "147 or 148-New Westminster Station" on destination signs.

Two additional trips have been added to #316 route departing downtown Vancouver on Saturday afternoons. Trips will now leave at 3:14 PM, 3:44 PM, 4:14 PM, 5:00 PM, 5:30 PM and 6:03 PM.

413 New Westminster/Richmond Exchange

The #413 "Shopper" service between New Westminster and Richmond will be rerouted via the 22nd Street Station in both directions thus providing a SkyTrain connection.

154 and 155 Coguitlam Rec. Centre/ **New Westminster**

The #154 and #155 routes will be terminated at New Westminster Station in order to provide a SkyTrain connection. Westbound buses leaving Coquitlam Rec. Centre will now display "154 155-New Westminster Station" on destination signs. In addition the 154 bus will be rerouted in uptown New Westminster via 8th Avenue, 5th Street, 6th Avenue in both directions.

316 Scottsdale Mall/Vancouver

319 Scottsdale Mall/ **New Westminster Station**

The #319 route will terminate at New Westminster Station during off-peak periods. During peak periods when the #319 operates to Vancouver, buses will route via New Westminster Station for SkyTrain connections. Trips that terminate at New Westminster Station will display the station name on the destination sign

320 Langley/New Westminster Station 321 White Rock Centre/ **New Westminster Station**

The #320 and #321 routes will terminate at New Westminster Station during off-peak periods. For travel to uptown New Westminster passengers should transfer to the #120, #154, or #155 routes at the station. During peak periods when the #320 and #321 routes operate to Vancouver, buses will route via New Westminster Station for SkyTrain connections. Trips that terminate at New Westminster Station will display the station name on the

351 North Bluff/Vancouver

On weekdays the early AM peak schedule has been adjusted to include a 5:30 AM and 6:00 AM departure from White Rock Centre. The existing 5:48 AM departure will be discontinued. In addition, an earlier AM trip had been added on Saturdays departing White Rock Centre at 6:40 AM arriving in downtown Vancouver at 7:38 AM.
