3 Main/Robson

The Main/Robson route will be operated as #3 in both directions.

4 Nanaimo Station/Blanca

The **4** route will be extended from Nanaimo and 22nd Avenue to Nanaimo Station. Service along 22nd Avenue and Slocan will now be provided by the **25** and **29** routes. In addition, the Nanaimo Station/Blanca route will be operated as **#4** in both directions.

7 Powell/Dunbar

The Powell/Dunbar route will be renumbered to #7 in both directions. In addition, departure times have been adjusted slightly.

8 Fraser/Davie

The Fraser/Davie route will be operated as #8 in both directions.

10 Hastings Express/UBC

The Hastings Express/UBC route will be renumbered to #10 in both directions.

19 Metrotown Station/Stanley Park

The 19 route will be extended east from Joyce Loop to Metrotown Station via Kingsway, Willingdon and Central Blvd. Buses will no longer operate into Joyce Loop but will now stop on Kingsway at Joyce. Eastbound buses will display 19 Metrotown Station while westbound buses will show 19 Stanley Park on destination signs.

28 Phibbs Exchange/Joyce Station

The 28 route will be extended from the existing northern terminus at Kootenay Loop to Phibbs Exchange, replacing the 232 Queens which will terminate at Phibbs Exchange. The Phibbs Exchange connection will provide a direct link between North Vancouver and SkyTrain. South of Kootenay Loop, the 28 route will operate over the existing route to Boundary and Vanness, then via Vanness to Joyce Station. On Sunday and holidays the #28 will be operated via Joyce and Kingsway enroute to Joyce Station. Buses will no longer enter Kootenay Loop, but stop instead at Hastings and Kootenay.

41 Joyce Station/UBC

The **41** route will be extended from Joyce Loop to Joyce Station. Buses will no longer operate to the Metrotown Station in Burnaby, however, connecting service will be provided by the **19** route on Kingsway or SkyTrain. Eastbound trips will now display **41 Joyce Station** on destination signs.

42 Spanish Banks/Chancellor

The Spanish Banks/Chancellor route will be renumbered to 42 in both directions.

49 Metrotown Station/Dunbar Loop (UBC peak hours)

The **49** route will be rerouted in Burnaby to serve the Metrotown Station. The new route is via Imperial, Willingdon, Central Blvd. to the Metrotown Station. Connecting service to Nelson and Kingsway will be provided from Metrotown Station by the **107**, **111** and **130** routes. In addition, eastbound buses will now display **49 Metrotown Station** on destination signs.

101 Lougheed Mall/22nd St. Station

The 101 is a new route connecting Lougheed Mall, East Burnaby and Uptown New Westminster with 22nd Street Station. The 101 route will operate via Government, Cariboo, Cumberland, 16th Avenue, 1st Street, 12th Avenue, 6th Street, 6th Avenue, 8th Street, 8th Avenue to 22nd Street Station. The 101 route replaces portions of the existing 102 and 108 routes.

102 New Westminster Station/22nd St. Station

The 102 route will now connect New Westminster Station with 22nd Street Station via Columbia, 2nd Street and 8th Avenue. The 102 route will continue to serve Uptown New Westminster (6th Street and 6th Avenue), however, it will no longer operate to East Burnaby, Lougheed Mall or Queensboro (see new 101 and 104 routes).

104 22nd St. Station/Annacis Island/Queensboro

The **104** is a new route connecting Queensboro and Annacis Island with 22nd Street Station. The **104** replaces the section of route in Queensboro formerly operated by the **102** route. Service to Annacis Island will be provided by a loop routing which will improve service coverage on the northern part of the Island. On Sunday and Holidays only, the **104** route will be extended from the 22nd Street Station to New Westminster Station.

106 New Westminster Station/Edmonds Station

The **106** route provides service along 6th Street and Edmonds connecting New Westminster Station with Edmonds Station. Service west of Edmonds along Kingsway in Burnaby will be provided by the new **107** route. On Sunday and Holidays only, the **106** will operate to Vancouver via Metrotown Station (bypassing Edmonds Station).

107 Edmonds Station/Metrotown Station

The **107** is a new route replacing the **106** and **112** routes along Kingsway between Edmonds Loop and Kingsway and McKay. The **107** will connect with the SkyTrain line at Edmonds and Metrotown Stations. On Sunday and Holidays, this route replaced by extensions of the **106** and **112** routes.

108 Eighth Ave/New Westminster Station

The **108** will now connect the Queens Park Hospital & Royal Square with New Westminster Station only. Service west of New Westminster Station along 8th Avenue to 22nd Street Station will be provided by the new **101** and **102** routes.

110 Municipal Hall/Metrotown Station

The **110** is a new route operating in a clockwise loop starting at Metrotown Station via Central Blvd., Beresford, Patterson, Moscrop, Gilpin to the Burnaby Municipal Hall, returning via Canada Way, Burris, Grange (Oakland), Nelson, Kingsway and McKay to the Metrotown Station.

111 Municipal Hall/Metrotown Station

The 111 is a new route operating in the reverse direction to the 110 route.

112 New Westminster Station/Edmonds Station

The 112 provides service along 12th Street and 14th Avenue, connecting New Westminster Station with Edmonds Station. Service west of Edmonds along Kingsway is provided by the new 107 route. On Sunday and Holidays only, the 112 route will extend from Edmonds Station via the 107 route to Metrotown Station and beyond to Vancouver.

114 Burnaby South/Metrotown Station

The 114 route connects the South Slope area in Burnaby with the Royal Oak and Metrotown Stations. Service south of the Royal Oak Station will now operate in a clockwise loop via Royal Oak, Clinton, Gilley, Marine Drive, Nelson, Rumble to Royal Oak. Service to Edmonds Station and Edmonds Loop will discontinued.

115 Burnaby South/Metrotown Station (peak hours only)

The 115 is a new peak period route operating in the reverse direction to the 114 route.

116 Metrotown Station/Suncrest

The **116** is a new route connecting the Suncrest area in Burnaby with Metrotown Station. The **116** replaces the portion of the existing **130** route south of Metrotown Station.

120 New Westminster Station/Vancouver

Departure times throughout the day have been adjusted slightly. In addition, the downtown Vancouver terminus has been relocated to Dunsmuir at Burrard (adjacent Burrard Station).

130 Metrotown Station/Kootenay Loop

The **130** route will be terminated at the Metrotown Station. Service south of Metrotown Station will now be provided by the **116** route. In addition, the current routing via Burke, Gilpin, dwood will be discontinued in favour of a direct route along lingdon.

131 Edmonds Station/Kootenay Loop

Departure times on the 131 route have been adjusted slightly throughout the day.

132 Edmonds Station/Kootenay Loop

Departure times on the 132 route have been adjusted slightly throughout the day.

135 Hastings East/Kootenay Loop

The late night (owl) service will be rerouted from Kootenay Loop via Hastings, Inlet, Ridge, Duthie, Curtis, Sperling, Hastings and return to Kootenay Loop. This affects only those trips operating after 12:35 a.m.

152 Port Coquitlam Centre/Vancouver

Departure times of the **152** on Sunday and Holidays have been adjusted to improve connections at Port Coquitlam Centre.

154 Coquitlam Rec. Centre/22nd St. Station

The **154** bus will be rerouted in New Westminster to the 22nd Street Station. The new route will provide a Maillardville, Sapperton and uptown New Westminster connection to the 22nd Street SkyTrain Station.

155 Coquitlam Rec. Centre/22nd Street Station

The **155** route will be rerouted in New Westminster via 6th Avenue to 22nd Street Station. In addition, the **155** will be rerouted via Braid, Columbia, Hospital, Richmond, Cumberland and 6th Avenue in order to serve the Royal Columbian Hospital. The new route will provide an east-west crosstown link in New tminster.

160 South Port Coquitlam/Vancouver

Departure times on the ${\bf 160}$ route have been adjusted slightly.

232 Phibbs Exchange/Grouse Mountain

The **232** will terminate at Phibbs Exchange instead of Kootenay Loop. Connecting service to Kootenay Loop and beyond to Joyce Station (SkyTrain connection) will be provided by the **28** route.

239 Capilano College/Park Royal

Departure times from Park Royal have been adjusted slightly in order to improve "meets" at Lonsdale Quay and Phibbs Exchange.

319 Scottsdale Mall/New Westminster Station

This route will terminate at New Westminster Station. Service to downtown Vancouver will be provided by SkyTrain. The **120** route will provide connecting service along 8th Street and Canada Way.

320 Langley/New Westminster Station

This route will terminate at New Westminster Station. Service to downtown Vancouver will be provided by SkyTrain. The **120** route will provide connecting service along 8th Street and Canada Way.

321 White Rock Centre/New Westminster Station

This route will terminate at New Westminster Station. Service to downtown Vancouver will be provided by SkyTrain. The **120** route will provide connecting service along 8th Street and Canada Way.

351 North Bluff/Vancouver

The **351** trip leaving downtown Vancouver at 3:36 p.m. will be replaced by a new 354 White Rock South trip at 3:35 p.m.

354 White Rock South/Vancouver

The **354** trip leaving downtown Vancouver at 5:06 p.m. will now operate from White Rock Centre only departing at 6:26 p.m. A new **354** trip leaving downtown Vancouver at 3:35 p.m. will be added to the schedule.

425 Airport South/Richmond Exchange

Two additional trips leaving Richmond Exchange at 6:42 and 7:42 a.m. have been extended from the Airport South Terminus to Okanagan Helicopters.

640 Scottsdale Mall/Tsawwassen Ferry

Some **640** trips Monday through Friday will be rerouted via 80th Street, 44th Avenue and 72nd Street in order to serve the Boundary Bay Airport. Departure times from Scottsdale Mall and Matthews Interchange will be adjusted slightly.

Some Richmond Express Services to be Rerouted via Laing Bridge

The 402, 407 and 408 express services will be rerouted via the Moray Channel and Arthur Laing Bridge upon completion of the new commuter ramps on Sea Island. The rerouting will provide a faster, more direct route between Richmond and Vancouver than the current Oak Street Bridge route. The change which is tentatively planned in late March is explained in new Richmond bus timetables issued on March 7.
