New DavPass can be purchased for future use BC



In response to passengers who find it inconvenient to buy a regular DavPass at a Skytrain Station or SeaBus Terminal, and in an attempt to simplify transit travel for Expo visitors, a new scratch and ride DayPass will be introduced May 1 for a sixmonth trial period.

The new pass, the first of its kind in Canada, will be widely available at all 7-Eleven Stores, beginning May 7, Vancouver Ticket Centre outlets, Overseas Chinese Voice outlets and many other FareSaver outlets.

An adult DayPass will cost \$3.00. A concession Day-Pass for senior citizens, students to grade 12 with valid GoCards and children aged 5-11, will cost \$1.50.

The most important feature of the DayPass is its convenience. One or more can be purchased in advance for personal use or for friends coming to town. When the pass is to be used, the month and day is scratched and the pass is valid for unlimited rides on that date on buses. SkyTrains and SeaBuses, after 9:30 a.m. 'til the end of the service day (all day on a Saturday or Sunday)

The following service changes will make it more convenient for transit riders to get to and from Expo 86. They will be implemented May 2 and continue for the duration of the fair. Additional changes will be implemented May 30.

13 Cambie/Downtown

The #13 is a new trolley coach route connecting Cambie and 49th Avenue with downtown. The #13 will operate only when Expo 86 is open, providing additional service along the Cambie corridor. In the downtown area, the #13 will loop via Smuthe, Hamilton, Pender, Homer, Hastings, Cambie and Nelson, returning to the Cambie Street Bridge.

22 Downtown/Macdonald - 16th Ave.

The downtown terminus of the #22 route, a daytime service, will be relocated to Beatty & Dunsmuir (Stadium Station). Service along Pender, between Cambie and Columbia, will be discontinued.

100 Port Coguitlam Centre/Airport

The #100 route will be rerouted via the new Lougheed Park-Ride lot (Lougheed and King Edward Avenue) in both directions. In addition, a new express route (#170) will connect the lot directly with New Westminster Station.

Information in this issue of the Buzzer concerns transit service changes, effective May 2, for Expo 86, Richmond and SkyTrain, as well as West Vancouver.

Bus Service Changes effective Friday. May 2, 1986 For Services Operated by BC Transit

159 Lougheed Mall/New Westminster Station (Express)

The #159 is a new express route connecting Lougheed Mall with New Westminster Station. The #159 will leave Lougheed Mall

on the hour and half hour between 8:30 AM and 11:00 AM in order to meet the prime travel times to Expo 86. Return service to Lougheed Mall from New Westminster Station is provided by the #147 and #148 routes.

170 Park-Ride/New Westminster Station (Express)

The #170 is a new express route linking the Coguitlam Centre and Lougheed Park-Ride lots with the New Westminster SkyTrain Station. The #170 will operate every 15 minutes during peak hours, every 30 minutes mid-day and every 60 minutes during the evening. Service will operate to 1:30 AM each day, commencing at 6:00 AM weekdays and 8:00 AM on weekends.

319 Scottsdale Mall/New Westminster Station

The #319 route will be rerouted via the new Scott Road Park-Ride lot in both directions. The new lot will also be served by a new express route (#329) which will link the site directly with New Westminster SkyTrain Station.

329 Park-Ride/New Westminster Station (Express)

The #329 is a new express route connecting the Scott Road Park-Ride lot (110 Avenue between Scott Road and 128 Street) with New Westminster Station. The #329 will operate every 10 minutes during peak periods and every 30 minutes at all other times. Service will operate to midnight each day, commencing at 6:00 AM weekdays and at 8:30 AM on weekends.

353 Marine Drive/White Rock Centre

Sunday and Holiday service will be reinstated on the #353 route beginning Sunday, May 4. The new summer schedule will be in effect until October 13, 1986

640 Scottsdale Mall/Tsawwassen Ferry

The #640 service will be improved to every hour (from every 2 hours) in order to connect with the hourly ferry schedule beginning May 2, 1986.

Park and Ride to Expo 86

Beginning May 2, Park and Ride lots at Scott Road, Coguitlam Centre and Lougheed Highway at King Edward will open. and regular express bus service will be provided to and from New Westminster SkyTrain Station. (See routes #170, #319 and #329 listed in this issue of the Buzzer)

The Scott Road lot will accommodate 921 vehicles while the others will hold 590 and 990 respectively.

Bus/SkyTrain Service Changes

SkyTrain service will be increased May 2, 1986 to coincide with the opening of Expo 86. The changes include the following:

- · Frequency of service will be improved to every 3 minutes during peak periods, every 4 minutes during the mid-day early evening and every 5 minutes after 10:30 PM.
- Service will be extended 1 hour at nights. Last departure from New Westminster Station will be 12:45 AM and from Waterfront at 1:15 AM
- Full Sunday and Holiday service will commence May 4. The first train will leave New Westminster at 8:20 AM and Waterfront at 8:50 AM. The last departure from New Westminster will be 12:45 AM and from Waterfront at 1:15 AM.

28 Phibbs Exchange/Joyce Station

With the introduction of full Sunday and Holiday Skytrain service, the #28 will be rerouted via Boundary and Vanness to Jovce Station. The new route will provide a more direct connection to SkyTrain on Sunday and Holidays. Early morning trips operating prior to the first SkyTrain (i.e. trips leaving Kootenay Loop 6:24 through 8:24 AM) will continue to operate Boundary, Kingsway, Jovce to Jovce Station.

Richmond: regular service changes

402 Two Road/Vancouver

During peak periods, the #402 service between Richmond Exchange and Vancouver will be rerouted via the Arthur Laing Bridge. Buses will no longer stop at Marine and Oak, Oak and 71st Avenue or Marine and Hudson. New stops for the #402 will be provided at Granville and 70th Avenue. Service will route by the Sexsmith Park & Ride on Sexsmith in both directions.

407 Gilbert/Vancouver

During peak periods, the #407 service between Richmond Exchange and Vancouver will be rerouted via the Arthur La Bridge. Buses will no longer stop at Marine and Oak, Oak 71st Avenue or Marine and Hudson. New stops for the #407 will be provided at Granville and 70th Avenue. Service will continue to route through the Sexsmith Park & Ride in the AM but in the PM will be routed alongside the Sexsmith Park & Ride on Sexsmith.

408 Garden City/Vancouver

During peak periods, the #408 service between Richmond Exchange and Vancouver will be rerouted via the Arthur Laing Bridge. Buses will no longer stop at Marine and Oak, Oak and 71st Avenue or Marine and Hudson. New stops for the #408 will be provided on Granville at 70th Avenue. Service will route by the Sexsmith Park & Ride on Sexsmith in both directions.
