

16 29th Avenue Station/18 Arbutus

The 16/18 route will be rerouted from Earles and 29th Avenue, via 29th Avenue, to the 29th Avenue SkyTrain Station. Service south of Earles and 29th Avenue will now be provided by the 26 route.

19 Metrotown Station/Stanley Park

Frequency of service will be improved throughout the day for Expo.

22 Downtown/Macdonald-16th Avenue

A 15 minute Sunday and Holiday service will be restored for the duration of Expo 86.

25 Brentwood/Blanca

Peak period trips to UBC will be discontinued for the summer period. Regular UBC service will be reinstated effective September 2, 1986.

26 Joyce Station/29th Avenue Station

The 26 service will be rerouted to connect Joyce Station with 29th Avenue Station, via Champlain Heights and Champlain Mall. The 26 will replace the 27 route south of Joyce Station and the 16 route south of 29th Avenue Station.

27 Kootenay Loop/Joyce Station

The 27 route will terminate at Joyce Station instead of Champlain Heights. Connecting service from Joyce Station to Champlain Heights, Champlain Mall and Killarney will be provided by the 26 route.

29 Elliott/29th Avenue Station

Departure times have been adjusted throughout the day. Sunday and Holiday service levels between 12 noon and 6:00 PM have been improved to every 20 minutes.

49 Metrotown Station/Dunbar Loop

Peak period trips to UBC will be discontinued for the summer period. Regular UBC service will be reinstated effective September 2, 1986.

104 22nd Street Station/Annacis Island/ Oueensboro

Sunday and Holiday service will terminate at the 22nd Street Station instead of the New Westminster Station.

106 New Westminster Station/Metrotown Station

The 106 route will be extended from Edmonds Station to Metrotown Station, replacing the former 107 route. This will eliminate the transfer at Edmonds Station between the 106 and 107 routes. Service levels during the peak periods, evenings and Sundays will be improved. In addition, Sunday and Holiday service will operate the same route as weekdays, providing an Edmonds Station connection.

107 Edmonds Station/Metrotown Station

The 107 route will be incorporated into the 106 route.

112 New Westminster Station/Edmonds Station

Sunday and Holiday service will terminate at Edmonds Station, similar to weekdays. In addition, departure ti throughout the day have been adjusted.

147 Coquitlam Centre/New Westminster Station

Service extended at nights to include a 1:09 AM trip from New Westminster Station, Monday through Saturday, and 12:39 AM and 1:09 AM trips on Sunday and Holidays.

154 Coguitlam Recreation Centre/22nd Street Station

Service extended to provide a 1:05 AM departure from 22nd Street Station to Coguitlam Recreation Centre only, Monday through Sunday.

160 Port Coquitlam Centre/Vancouver

Service extended at nights to include a 1:00 AM trip from Vancouver to Port Coguitlam Centre only, Monday through Sunday, as well as additional trip at 12:00 midnight on Sundays and Holidays.

162 River Springs/Vancouver 163 Prairie/Vancouver 164 Coast Meridian/Vancouver

The 162, 163 and 164 routes will be rerouted to serve the Coquitlam Centre Park-Ride lot at Lougheed and Barnet Highway. The rerouting will provide a direct link during peak periods between the lot and downtown Vancouver.

228 Lynn Valley/Lonsdale Quay

Sunday and Holiday departure times will be adjusted by 15 minutes during the afternoon.

229 Lynn Valley Centre/Lonsdale Quay

Service levels on Sunday and Holidays will be improved to every 30 minutes, to meet Expo demand.

230 Upper Lonsdale/Lonsdale Quay

Frequency of service will be improved to every 30 minutes on Sunday and Holidays. In addition, departure times have been adjusted by 15 minutes.

232 Phibbs Exchange/Grouse Mountain

408 Garden City/Vancouver

The 408 route will be extended from Richmond Exchange to Vancouver, between 9 AM and 12 noon, Monday through Saturday, and from 9 AM to 6:00 PM on Sunday and Holidays, to meet Expo 86 demand.

602 Tsawwassen Heights/Vancouver

Two additional trips will be operated on the 602 route, Monday through Friday, leaving 2nd Avenue and 52A Street at 8:37 AM and 9:32 AM.

Proposed transit changes in North Delta and Newton

BC Transit, in consultation with the Districts of Surrey and Delta, is proposing major changes to North Delta and Newton bus routes, beginning January, 1987. The changes are intended to integrate the area's bus routes with SkyTrain and to utilize the new Annacis Bridge.

Specific changes include the rerouting of the #316 service from Scottsdale Mall to the 22nd Street SkyTrain Station in New Westminster. Other changes include the introduction of a number of peak period express routes that will link 112th Street, 116th Street and 72nd Avenue directly with SkyTrain. Improved feeder bus service is also proposed for Sunshine Hills and West Newton. In addition, the #321 route, connecting Whalley and White Rock Centre, will operate via the Newton town centre.

In order to provide area residents with an opportunity to view and comment on the proposed route plans, BC Transit will be holding a series of Public Open Houses in Newton and North Delta. Residents are invited to drop in to review the plans at the Newton Library, Scottsdale Mall and the George Mackie Library. While there they can also meet with members of BC Transit's planning staff who will be happy to answer questions and receive comments on the proposed
