

"Blue Bus" service changes effective September 1

Services operated by
West Vancouver Municipal Transportation Department

252 Inglewood/Vancouver

The 6:00 p.m. trip leaving Vancouver, Monday through Friday will now start from Park Royal at 6:16 p.m. Connecting service from Vancouver will be provided by a #250 Dunderave, leaving at 6:00 p.m.

257 Horseshoe Bay Express/Vancouver

The #257 route will be extended from the Gleneagles Park & Ride lot to Eagle Harbour via Marine Drive. In addition, a new trip will leave Eagle Harbour at 7:12 a.m. and arrive in downtown Vancouver at 7:55 a.m.

258 West Vancouver/UBC

The #258 UBC route will be restored with the start of fall classes. During the a.m. peak period, buses will be rerouted via the Burrard Bridge to UBC. In the p.m. peak period an additional trip will leave UBC at 5:36 p.m.

Two detained for operator assault

When five male passengers were asked to leave a bus because of their boisterous behaviour and obscene language, three assaulted the operator. The operator was dragged from the bus and the assault continued until passing police officers intervened and managed to arrest two of the suspects — a man and a youth.

The youth pleaded guilty to assault in Family Court and was sentenced to nine months in the Youth Detention Centre. The man was found guilty of assault in Vancouver Provincial Court and sentenced to 30 days imprisonment.



New student GoCard Picture perfect I.D.

Students, make sure you go to the photo session that has been scheduled at your school within the next few weeks, and get your new picture perfect GoCard. In the meantime, last year's GoCards will be valid until October 15, 1986.

You're eligible if you...

- Live within the transit service area.
- Are 14 to 19 years old (inclusive) or are in grade 8 at the start of the school year.
- Attend classes full time at a public or private school in grades 8 to 12 (inclusive).

Save money

During peak hours (before 9:30 a.m. and between 3:00 and 6:30 p.m., Monday through Friday) full adult fare could cost you almost twice as much as the fare you pay with a valid GoCard. (cont. p. 2)

(GoCard cont.)

	One zone	Two zones	Three zones
Adult	\$1.15	\$1.55	\$2.20
GoCard	\$.60	\$.80	\$1.10

The rest of the time, in off-peak hours, your valid GoCard will let you take any one-way trip for a flat fare of 60¢.

But remember...

- You must show your GoCard or pay full adult fare.
- GoCards are not transferable. If anyone else attempts to use your GoCard it will be confiscated.
- If you leave the school system, your GoCard must be returned to the school principal.

No charge 'til October 31

There is no charge for a GoCard up to and including October 31, 1986. After that date, all students except those that are new will be required to pay a \$5 fee. The \$5 fee will always apply to the replacement of lost cards.



Excess baggage

Transit vehicles are not designed to carry bulky items such as large packs, parcels and suitcases. Anything that isn't flat enough to be carried close to the body or compact enough to carry on the knees will probably obstruct the aisle or deny the use of a seat to another passenger, especially in the rush hour.

So please be considerate of the comfort and safety of your fellow passengers, and if there is any question as to what is acceptable, please accept the experienced judgment of a bus operator, SeaBus attendant or SkyTrain attendant.

BC Transit bus service changes effective September 1

(Most of the changes will actually occur September 2, since September 1 is Labour Day).

25 Brentwood/UBC

Peak-period trips on the #25 route will be extended to UBC with the start of fall classes. In addition, departure times will be adjusted throughout the day.

49 Metrotown Station/UBC

Peak-period trips on the #49 route will be extended to UBC with the start of fall classes. In addition, #49 buses will be rerouted in Burnaby via Imperial, McKay, Maywood, Willingdon and Central Boulevard to Metrotown Station.

100 Harrison Loop/Airport

Early Sunday morning trips leaving Harrison Loop at 6:34 a.m. and 7:34 a.m. will be discontinued because ridership is low. Regular #100 service will operate between New Westminster and the Airport every 60 minutes.

104 Queensboro/22nd Street Station

Trips leaving 22nd Street Station at 10:00 a.m., 1:00 p.m. and 6:09 p.m., Monday through Friday, will be rerouted from the Annacis Traffic Circle to Ewen and Furness.

110 Municipal Hall/Metrotown Station

Departure times on the #110 route will be adjusted to approximately 10 minutes after current times.

111 Municipal Hall/Metrotown Station

Departure times on the #111 route will be adjusted to approximately 10 minutes after current times.

114 Burnaby South/Metrotown Station

During the off-peak, service will be reduced on the #114 route to every 60 minutes. A new #115 route will be introduced during the off-peak to retain a 30-minute service between Clinton Avenue and Metrotown.

115 Edmonds Station/Metrotown Station

The #115 route will be changed to restore a direct link between the Burnaby South area and Edmonds Station. After leaving Metrotown Station buses will now operate via Sussex, Imperial, Royal Oak, Clinton, Gilley, Rumble, and 19th Street to Edmonds Station.

211 Seymour/Phibbs Exchange

The schedule of the #211 will be revised to provide 15-minute service between Seymour and Phibbs Exchange during the a.m. peak period. In addition, the trip leaving Deep Cove at 6:25 a.m. will continue on to downtown Vancouver.

292 Upper Lynn Valley/Vancouver

#292 is a new peak-period express route connecting Lynn Valley with downtown Vancouver. The #292 will follow the regular #210 route but will bypass Phibbs Exchange. Buses will leave Underwood and Dempsey at 7:06 and 7:36 a.m. and Hornby and Dunsmuir at 4:40 and 5:10 p.m.

351 North Bluff/Vancouver

Departure times from Vancouver during the p.m. peak period have been adjusted slightly.

352 Crescent Road/Vancouver

Departure times from Vancouver during the p.m. peak period have been adjusted slightly.

353 Marine Drive/Vancouver

Departure times from Vancouver during the p.m. peak period have been adjusted slightly.

354 White Rock South/Vancouver

Departure times from Vancouver during the p.m. peak period have been adjusted slightly.

490 Steveston/Vancouver

The #490 is a new peak-period express route connecting the Steveston area with downtown Vancouver via Steveston Highway and Highway #99. The #490 will leave Moncton at No. 2 Road at 6:50 a.m., 7:20 a.m. and 7:50 a.m., and Burrard at Dunsmuir at 4:05 p.m., 4:35 p.m. and 5:05 p.m.

Note:

Shortly after the Annacis Bridge opens, the 314 Scottsdale Mall/Street Station service will be rerouted across the bridge. The exact date of the change will be announced. A Rider Alert will give full details.

Taxi Stand at New Westminster SkyTrain Station

SkyTrain passengers who wish to continue their trip by cab are asked to exit the station on to McNeely Street, where they will find a Taxi Stand.

Cabs are discouraged from stopping on 8th Street.
