

Revised stopping procedures at Cliveden Interchange (Annacis Island)

The #312, #340 and #353 services will continue to stop at Cliveden Interchange (#353 Northbound only on request). The #314, #390 and #391 services travelling in both directions, will bypass Cliveden.

345 White Rock Centre/Guildford

The morning shopper trip will leave White Rock Centre at 9:43 a.m. and arrive in Guildford at 10:15 a.m.

351 Crescent Beach/Vancouver

Sunday and holiday departure times from Burrard Station will be adjusted slightly to improve meets with #321/354 services at White Rock Centre.

353 Ocean Park/22nd St. Station

The 4:55 p.m. trip from 22nd St. Station has been rescheduled to leave five minutes later, at 5:00 p.m.

354 White Rock South/Vancouver

A.M. peak departure times from White Rock have been changed to provide trips up to seven minutes earlier than at present. This will distribute passenger loadings more evenly.

358 Sunnyside/White Rock Centre

The early morning shopper trip will leave White Rock Centre at 9:14 a.m., and arrive back at 9:39 a.m., connecting with the #321, #351 and #353 services.

401 One Road/Vancouver

406 Railway/Vancouver

407 Gilbert/Vancouver

Peak-period schedules, Monday through Friday, will return to pre-summer times.

602 Tsawwassen Heights/Vancouver

Service every 15 minutes, during peak periods, will be reintroduced with the beginning of fall.

286 North Vancouver/UBC

This express route, operating between North Vancouver and UBC, will be reinstated with the return of fall classes. Schedules will be the same as last year's.

Detailed bus, SeaBus and SkyTrain timetables are available at a number of convenient outlets, including public libraries, city and municipal halls, information centres, community centres, chambers of commerce, the BC Transit Lost Property Office at 611 West Hastings and the Vancouver Travel InfoCentre at 562 Burrard.

West Vancouver "Blue Bus" service changes

258 West Vancouver/UBC

This route, operating between West Vancouver (Dundarave) and UBC, will be reinstated with the return of fall classes at UBC.

Buses will leave Dundarave at 7:30 and 8:30 a.m. — in time for 8:30 and 9:30 a.m. class starts.

In the afternoon, buses will leave UBC Loop at 3:40 and 4:40 p.m.

Because of low ridership levels last year, service will not be provided at 5:37 p.m.

BC Transit Bus Service Changes

Effective September 7

These service changes fall into two major categories: the re-instatement of regular fall/winter peak service and the introduction of new services to UBC and SFU.

- 3 Main/Robson**
- 8 Fraser/Davie**

Peak-period schedules, Monday through Friday, will return to pre-summer levels.

25 Brentwood/UBC

Peak-period trips, Monday through Friday, will be extended from Blanca Loop to UBC with the start of fall classes.

49 Metrotown Station/UBC

Peak-period trips, Monday through Friday, will be extended from Dunbar Loop to UBC with the start of fall classes.

81 Broadway Station/UBC

NEW FAST TRAX ROUTE

This new express route will connect Broadway SkyTrain Station with UBC. Westbound buses will pick up passengers at all transfer points on Broadway, up to and including Broadway and Oak, and then proceed non-stop to UBC. From UBC, buses will operate non-stop to Broadway and Oak, then drop off passengers at transfer points along Broadway between Oak Street and Broadway Station.

85 Downtown/UBC

This express route from Waterfront Station to UBC, via Burrard Street, will be reinstated with the return of fall classes at UBC.

Buses will leave Waterfront Station at 7:51 and 8:51 a.m. only, Monday through Friday, connecting with the 7:33 and 8:33 a.m. SeaBus departures from Lonsdale Quay.

106 New Westminster Stn./Metrotown Stn.

Because of less demand during peak periods, Monday through Friday, buses will operate every 12 minutes instead of the 10-minute service presently offered.

110 Municipal Hall/Metrotown Station

The #110 loop service will be changed to operate in both directions between Metrotown Station, Patterson Station and Burnaby Municipal Hall. Service formerly provided on Burriss and Oakland by the #110 route will be provided by the new #144 SFU/Metrotown route. Passengers using the #110 route should note changes in departure times.

111 Municipal Hall/Metrotown Station

The #111 loop service will be discontinued. Passengers boarding on Patterson, Moscrop and Gilpin should use the #110 route. For service along Burriss and Oakland, passengers should use the new #144 SFU/Metrotown route.

112 New Westminster Stn./Edmonds Stn.

Peak-period service, Monday through Friday, will be adjusted slightly to provide a bus every 12 minutes instead of the 10-minute service presently offered.

114 Burnaby South/Metrotown Station

115 Edmonds Station/Metrotown Station

P.M. peak departure times, Monday through Friday, will be adjusted slightly.

116 Metrotown Station/Suncrest

Because of low ridership, the 6:18 p.m. trip from Metrotown Station, Monday through Friday, will be discontinued. The departure bay at Metrotown Station will change from #4 to #1.

130 Metrotown Station/Kootenay Loop

Departure times throughout the day will be adjusted slightly. Two additional southbound trips will leave Brentwood at 2:53 p.m. and 3:23 p.m., Monday through Friday.

131 Edmonds Station/Kootenay Loop

132 Edmonds Station/Kootenay Loop

The #131 and #132 diversion, via the Burnaby Lake Sports Complex and the former Kensington Transit Centre, will be discontinued. Buses will operate along Canada Way, and passengers travelling to Burnaby Lake will transfer to the #142 or #144 route. Departure times throughout the day will be adjusted slightly.

133 Lougheed Mall/Kootenay Loop

Evening and weekend departure times have been adjusted slightly.

The #133 evening/weekend route diversion via Westridge will be discontinued and replaced by expanded service on the #135.

135 SFU/Kootenay Loop

Evening and weekend services will be doubled to provide a bus every 30 minutes.

Hastings Street passengers will no longer have to transfer between the #133 and #142 routes at Duthie & Curtis to reach SFU.

142 Edmonds Station/SFU

Service on this route will be reduced to two a.m. and two p.m. peak-period trips, Monday through Friday. At all other times, the new #144 SFU/Metrotown Station route will provide service between SFU and the Municipal Hall, and the #131/132 routes will connect the Municipal Hall with Edmonds Station.

144 SFU/Metrotown Station

NEW FAST TRAX ROUTE

This new route will connect Metrotown Station with SFU. Buses will operate over the former #111 route between Metrotown Station (Bay #4) and Burnaby Municipal Hall. From there they will proceed via Norland, Sprott, Kensington and the regular #142 route to SFU.

Daytime buses will operate every 30 minutes; evening and Sunday buses every 60 minutes.

Revised stops at Metrotown Stn.

The #116 service will leave from Bay #1. The new #144 service will leave from Bay #4.

148 Anmore/New Westminster Station

An additional Sunday and holiday trip to Anmore will leave New Westminster Station at 10:09 pm. and Lougheed Mall at 10:30 p.m.

151 Port Coquitlam/Vancouver

152 Port Coquitlam/Vancouver

A.M. peak schedules, Monday through Friday, will return to pre-summer times.

154 Coquitlam Rec. Centre/Vancouver

155 Coquitlam Rec. Centre/Vancouver

P.M. peak schedules, Monday through Friday, will return to pre-summer levels.

160 South Port Coquitlam/Vancouver

Peak-period schedules, Monday through Friday, will return to pre-summer times.

214 Blueridge/Vancouver

The 7:32 a.m. trip from Blueridge to Phibbs Exchange will continue on to Vancouver.

236 Lonsdale Quay/Pemberton Heights

Three trips per day, Monday through Friday, will be routed via the W.E. Lucas Centre. As a result, there will be minor adjustments to scheduled departure times.

241 Upper Lonsdale/Vancouver

Peak-period schedules, Monday through Friday, will return to pre-summer times.

311 Scottsdale Mall/Vancouver


During the P.M. peak, departure times from Burrard Station have been revised slightly to better distribute passenger loadings.

320 Guildford/New Westminster Station

P.M. peak trips leaving New Westminster Station at 5:36 p.m. and 6:07 p.m., Monday through Friday, will continue on from Guildford to Fleetwood (Fraser Hwy. & 152 St.). With this addition, there will be a bus every 15 minutes between New Westminster and Fleetwood during this time period.
