New generation of GM buses enter service

BC Transit recently took delivery of 28 new GM Classic buses. The Classic is the first new GM bus design since 1959, when the familiar 'New Look', which has been the backbone of Greater Vancouver's diesel fleet since 1961, first came off the assembly line.

The Classic, built just outside Montreal, has an advanced design with 50 per cent more window area, double-stream front and rear doors, power steering, quieter performance and more space for standees, particularly at the rear of the bus.

This particular group of buses is also specially equipped for hill climbing. With features that include a Detroit Diesel Turbocharged engine, they can handle grades to 20 per cent instead of the normal buses' 12 to 14 per cent.

Each of the new Classics cost approximately \$200,000 and has a life expectancy of 20 years.

The new buses are operating on the #319 route in Surrey/Delta, the #147/148 routes in Coquitlam/Port Moody, SFU routes in Burnaby and the #229/230 routes on Lonsdale, North Vancouver.



White Rock Sandcastle Competition Sunday, July 12

To get to White Rock from Vancouver, passengers can ride **SkyTrain to New Westminster Station** and transfer to a #321 bus, or take a #351 bus from Vancouver. The #351 (terminus: Burrard Station) may be boarded at any stop on the Pender and Howe portion of the route, and then at Granville at 5th, Broadway, King Edward, 41st Ave., 49th Ave., 63rd Ave., Hudson at Marine, 71st & Oak, Massey Tunnel Exchange and Matthew's Interchange.

The White Rock terminus for both services will be Johnston & North Bluff. From there passengers may take a shuttle bus, operated by Surrey Bus Lines — fare 50¢, to the beach.

White Rock route changes

With heavy traffic expected for the sandcastle contest, it will be necessary to terminate the **351 Crescent Beach** at Johnston & North Bluff — traffic conditions will dictate which of several alternate routes the #351 will use to reach the terminus.

The #353 will operate across 16th Ave. (North Bluff), between 152nd St. and 128th St.

On the eastern side, the **354 White Rock South/White Rock Centre** will be withdrawn from service until traffic congestion clears. For further details call Transit Information at 261-5100.

Improved UBC and SFU service coming September 7th

On June 8th, 1987, the Vancouver Regional Transit Commission approved a number of service changes for implementation on Monday, September 7th, 1987.

Key changes include:

The introduction of a new Broadway Station - UBC express route. Designated #81, the new route will provide service at 15 to 30-minute intervals, Monday through Friday. Travel time will be less than 30 minutes.

The introduction of a new route connecting Metrotown Station and SFU. Designated #144, the new route will provide daytime service at 30-minute intervals, Monday through Saturday, and 60-minute service evenings and Sundays.

With the introduction of the #144 route, the existing 142 SFU/Edmonds Station route will provide service during peak periods only.
