## Waterfront Station's Howe Street exit closed October 13 - 17

While the Commonwealth heads of government are meeting downtown, October 13 to 17, the Howe Street entrance/exit for Waterfront SkyTrain Station will be closed. With the exception of one morning during this period, passengers will be able to leave and access the Station through Sinclair Centre. On October 13, from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., the corridor connecting the Sinclair Centre and the Station will be closed.

The Cordova Street exit will not be affected at any time.

## South Surrey route revision

### 353 Ocean Park/22nd St. Station

Effective Tuesday, October 13th, #353 buses operating to Ocean Park will follow the regular route along Marine Drive as far as 130th Street. They will then loop north on 130th Street, west on 16th Avenue and south on 128th Street. Mid-day service to Ocean Park Drive and 25th Avenue will continue as an extension of the regular #353 route.

## #100, #154 & #155 Services Rerouted

Because of operational problems at 20th St and Marine Way, eastbound trips from 22nd St. Station have been detoured.

When work to alleviate the problem has been completed (the date will be announced well in advance), #154 and #155 buses will return to their regular routes, but #100 buses travelling between Marine Way at 6th Ave. and Stewardson Way, in both directions, will be rerouted via 6th Ave. and 12th St.

From New Westminster Station, the first and last SkyTrains will leave at 8:20 a.m. and 11:45 p.m.

From Waterfront Station, the first and last SkyTrains will leave at 8:50 a.m. and 12:15 a.m.

From North Vancouver, the first and last SeaBuses will leave at 8:33 a.m. and 11:03 p.m.

From Vancouver, the first and last SeaBuses will leave at 8:47 a.m. and 11:17 p.m.

Single-zone fares (use your single-zone FareSaver) apply system-wide on holidays, and a DayPass or valid FareCard will allow unrestricted travel throughout the service day.
