
Stanley Park 100th Birthday events **June 19**

Following a short parade of antique cars and marching bands, opening ceremonies will be held at Brockton Oval, at 9:30 a.m. The first 1,000 people will be able to participate in a simultaneous balloon release. From 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. entertainment will be provided in four areas of the Park.

Free around the park shuttle bus service will begin at 8:00 a.m., operating from Lost Lagoon half-hourly 'til 9:30 a.m., then every five minutes 'til 6:00 p.m., and half-hourly 'til 7:00 p.m. (see route and stops on map). NO CARS WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE PARK

Children and families at Lumberman's Arch will see a mascot parade and performers including "Charlotte Diamond", "Gum Boot Lollipop" and "Sunshine Pies." There will also be kids' games, handpainting and magic arts.

Coquitlam — Northeast Burnaby Bus/SkyTrain integration plan

On May 26, 1988 the Vancouver Regional Transit Commission approved a revised Bus/SkyTrain integration plan for the Coquitlam-Northeast Burnaby area. The revised plan takes into account input received from the public at open house sessions held earlier this year, while retaining the basic principles of Bus/SkyTrain integration.

These are the major elements of the revised plan:

1. Service along Hastings Street will be maintained by retaining both the #151 and #152 services to Vancouver. They will follow the existing Willingdon-Hastings corridor.

2. A full 6-minute peak period, 15-minute mid-day and 30minute evening express service between Lougheed Mall and downtown Vancouver will be retained.

3. A new service (#156) will operate between Central Coquitlam and New Westminster Station, via Lougheed Mall. The existing #147 and #148 services combined with the #156 service will provide a bus every 71/2 minutes between Lougheed Mall and New Westminster Station, during the morning and afternoon peak periods.

4. The peak hour extensions of the #154 and #155 ro between Lougheed Mall and Vancouver will be eliminated. Vancouver-bound passengers on #154 and #155 buses will be required to transfer to either the #151/#152 services to Vancouver or to the #147/#148/#156 services to New Westminster Station.

The revised plan will take effect September 5, 1988.

BC Transit wishes to thank all those who attended and participated at the open house sessions, held at Lougheed Mall and Coquitlam Recreation Centre in January of this year. Public input at these sessions was instrumental in shaping the plan.
