SkyTrain Connections for Coquitlam and Northeast Burnaby

Effective September 5

Coquitlam and Northeast Burnaby residents will have improved rush-hour connections to SkyTrain, and easier access to destinations from New Westminster to Vancouver.

151 Port Coquitlam Centre/Vancouver 152 Port Coquitlam Centre/Vancouver

These routes will continue to provide all-day bus service between Coquitlam and Northeast Burnaby and downtown Vancouver. Departure times will be adjusted slightly.

154 Lougheed Mall/Coquitlam Recreation Centre/22nd Street Station

The #154 service will provide service between Lougheed Mall and 22nd Street Station, via the Coquitlam Recreation Centre. Passengers proceeding on to downtown Vancouver can transfer to SkyTrain at 22nd Street Station or to #151/152 buses at Lougheed Mall.


