The Vancouver Regional Transit Commission voted unanimously not to increase fares on the buses, SeaBus, SkyTrain, West Vancouver Blue Buses or handyDART.

In making the announcement, Mayor Don Lanskail, Chairman of the Commission, said: "I'm pleased to say we're holding the line on fares for the 1989/90 transit year.

Our full-fare customers will continue to be able to ride up to 100 kilometres in one direction for \$1.25 in the off-peak periods. The ride from Aldergrove to Lions Bay or from White Rock to the foot of Grouse Mountain is just \$1.25 — 65¢ for seniors or students. That's a great deal."

The Commission's share of the \$341.1 million budget for Vancouver Regional Transit System transit services in 1989/90 is \$180.3 million. This money is raised through fares, hydro levy, gas tax and the non-residential property tax. Neither the hydro levy nor the gas tax will be increased and the 1989/90 total of transit taxes collected from non-residential properties will remain at 1988/89 levels.

Increased ridership is expected to bring an extra \$1.8 million in revenues. "We're carrying more and more people on the buses, SeaBus and SkyTrain every year," said Mayor Lanskail. "In the past, ridership has increased approximately 1 per cent a year; this year we have carried 4.5 per cent more passengers. On a per-capita basis, residents of the Vancouver region now make almost twice as many transit trips as our neighbours in Seattle who have a similar sized transit system."

North Burnaby residents participate in planning process at three open houses

Three open house sessions were recently held in North Burnaby to give local residents the opportunity to comment on the proposed North Burnaby Transit Area Plan 1989 - 1992. BC Transit staff were on hand to respond to questions from the public. Plan maps were on display and various information materials were available at the sessions.

An estimated 140 persons attended the open house sessions, broken down among the venues as follows: Cameron Recreation Centre – 45; Lochdale Community School – 15; and Confederation Community Centre for the Retired – 80.

The written comments and suggestions received at the sessions are being evaluated and will be considered in finalizing the service plan. The first phase of the plan is scheduled for implementation this September. Additional open houses will be held in the next two years for phases II and III, scheduled for implementation in September 1990 and September 1991, respectively.
