POST-SECONDARY STUDENT ZONE EXEMPTION

<i>Available</i>	To full-time students at the following post-secondary institutions: The University of British Columbia Simon Fraser University Vancouver Community College-Langara Vancouver Community College-King Edward Capilano College Douglas College Kwantlen College British Columbia Institute of Technology Vancouver Vocational Institute Emily Carr College of Art and Design Pacific Marine Training Institute Native Training Centre
<i>Applicable</i>	To a journey made on regular scheduled service and Custom Transit within the transit service area.
<i>Fare</i>	Exemption from zone fares upon presentation of a valid one zone FareCard with approved I.D. and a BC Transit-approved post-secondary decal confirming eligibility.
<i>Special conditions</i>	The zone exemption is valid only with the one zone FareCard and is not valid with other fare payment methods such as cash, FareSaver ticket, etc. Not valid on buses operating on Charter Service.
<i>Effective date</i>	1 September 1989

All day, any day one-zone fares for post-secondary students

With a Fast Trax Transit Strip attached to their student I.D.'s (available at student unions), post-secondary students at the institutions listed on page 6 can travel throughout the system, anytime, on a regularly priced adult one-zone FareCard. Both I.D. and FareCard must be shown when boarding or when requested.

Timetable adjustments

9 Brentwood Exchange/Boundary Loop

In the New Westminster and Burnaby timetable and in the 9 Boundary/Renfrew/Granville/Alma/UBC timetable, the 9 Boundary Loop schedule shows the first Monday-Friday trip leaving Brentwood Exchange at 5:55 a.m. The first trip actually leaves at 6:10 a.m., arriving at Boundary Loop at 6:15 a.m. The schedule also shows the first Monday-Friday trip leaving Boundary Loop at 6:02 a.m. The first trip actually leaves at 6:17 a.m., arriving at Brentwood Exchange at 6:22 a.m.

High school student GoCards

A GoCard provides proof that the bearer is a high school student who is eligible to ride on the Vancouver Regional Transit System at Concession fares.

To be eligible for a GoCard a student must:

- live within the transit service area
- be aged 14 to 19 (inclusive) or be in grade 8 at the start of the school year
- attend classes full time at a public or private school — grades 8-12 (inclusive)

GoCards are issued automatically to all students whose schools have photography sessions. The Cards are distributed approximately two weeks after the photography session. In the meantime . . .

Students with 1988/89 GoCards who are still attending secondary school can use their GoCards until October 31, 1989, or until they receive their new ones.

New Grade 8 students will be able to ride at Concession rates without a GoCard until October 31, 1989. Students should advise the driver of their age, grade and school when boarding. If any difficulties are encountered they are requested to pay the adult fare, then note the time of travel, bus number and operator number and call BC Transit operations at 264-5266 with this information.

Older students who have lost their Cards over the summer should replace them immediately by going to:

Students may go to Photo Ident, 3640 Vanness Avenue, Vancouver, between 9:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. A GoCard application form (available in the school office) signed by a school official, proof of age (birth certificate or passport) and a \$5 fee are required.

No appointment is necessary and GoCards will be issued immediately.

Beginning October 28, GoCard photography sessions will also be provided in a mobile unit at locations throughout Greater Vancouver. (See page 3 for dates, times and places).

Single zone fares (use your single zone FareSavers) apply system-wide on holidays and a DayPass or valid FareCard will allow unrestricted travel throughout the service day.



SkyTrain extension to Surrey being tested

When the Hon. Rita M. Johnston, minister responsible for transit, rode SkyTrain on its first trip over SkyBridge, September 5, it marked the beginning of a six-month testing and commissioning period of the extension to Scott Road Station in Surrey. Service is scheduled to commence early in 1990.

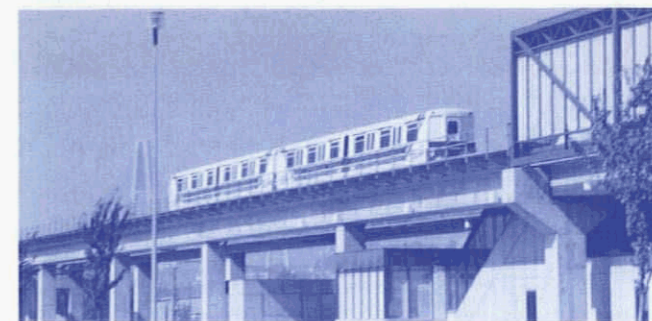
"This is an exciting day for me, and for the people of Surrey," said Mrs. Johnston, "This ride takes us one step closer to providing a SkyTrain connection to the communities on the south side of the Fraser River. Today we are testing SkyTrain to Scott Road Station; in 1993 SkyTrain will be operating to Whalley."

Scott Road Station, at Scott Road and 110th Avenue, will be the 17th station on the system. It will have a 1300-vehicle Park & Ride facility, a 13-bay bus loop and a handyDart bay. Travel time to downtown Vancouver is estimated at 30 min-
