

## Transit Fall Service Changes

Full rush hour levels return September 5 to meet fall/winter back-to-school and back-to-work travel demands. In addition, there will be significant improvements in service to UBC, SFU and Capilano College; routes in North Burnaby will be reorganized to meet demands in new growth areas; a new rush hour route will be introduced in Coquitlam's Westwood Plateau; and improved rush hour service will be provided in Surrey's East Guildford-Fleetwood area, on the Lougheed and Barnet corridors and on White Rock/Vancouver services. # Fall/Winter Transit Service Changes, effective September 4

#### 3 Main/Robson

To better accommodate passenger demand on Sunday and holidays, mid-day service will increase from every 12 minutes to every 10 minutes. In addition, departure times throughout the day will be changed.

#### 8 Fraser/Davie

Departure times throughout the week will change.

#### 9 Brentwood/Boundary Loop

Departure times throughout the week will change.

#### 9 Boundary/UBC

Service will be extended from Alma and 10th to the UBC Loop, providing a major crosstown link during UBC's winter session. Buses will operate at approximately 10 to 12 minute intervals during the day, Monday through Friday, departing from Bay #3 at UBC. In addition, departure times throughout the week will be adjusted.

#### 10 Hastings Express/UBC

Early morning service will be improved to provide better connections along Broadway and 10th Avenue, and to reduce passengers' waiting times. In addition, departure times throughout the week will be adjusted.

#### 14 Hastings/Arbutus

Departure times throughout the week will be adjusted.

#### 15 Cambie/Downtown

Departure times during morning rush hours will be adjusted.

#### 16 29th Ave. Station/Downtown

Departure times throughout the week will be adjusted.

#### 19 Downtown/Stanley Park

Sunday and holiday service to Stanley Park will revert to the winter schedule, with a bus every 20 minutes. Sunday and holiday departure times during the day will be adjusted

#### 20 Victoria/Granville

Departure times throughout the week will be adjusted.

#### 25 Brentwood/UBC

-FASTTRAX

With the start of fall classes at UBC, the route will be extended to UBC Loop during rush hours. In addition, buses will no longer operate to/from Boundary Loop as #9.

## 31 Broadway Stn./UBC (Express) FASTIRAL Service will be restored with the beginning of fall classes at LIBC

#### 41 Joyce Stn./UBC

THASTTRAX

Buses will depart from Bay #2 at UBC Loop.

#### 42 Spanish Banks/Chancellor FASTTRAX

With the start of fall classes, buses will revert to the regular winter route, with the terminus on the Lower Mall Lo

#### 49 Metrotown Stn./UBC

-FASTTRAX

The route will be extended to UBC during rush hours. In addition, morning rush hour service will be improved to alleviate overcrowding, and departure times throughout the week will be adjusted.

#### 85 Downtown/UBC (Express) FAST TRAX

Service will be restored with the beginning of fall classes at UBC.

#### 101 Lougheed Mall/Annacis Island

Morning rush hour buses will leave two minutes earlier from Lougheed Mall to improve meets with the #100 service at 22nd Street Station.

#### 110 Lougheed Mall/Metrotown Stn.

The route will be extended east from Burnaby Municipal Hall, via Norland, Sprott, Kensington, Broadway, Bainbridge and Government Road to Lougheed Mall. The new extension will replace the existing #133 route along Government Road, and provide a direct connection between Lougheed Mall, Burnaby Municipal Hall and Metrotown. In addition, rush hour service between the Municipal Hall and Metrotown Station will be increased to provide a bus every 15 minutes.

#### 133 Lougheed Mall/Kootenay Loop

#133 service will be replaced by the new #110 and #134 services.

#### 134 Lougheed Mall/Kootenay Loop

This is a new route that combines portions of the old #133 and #136 routes. The #134 route will serve Forest Grove, Forest Hills, Montecito and Greystone every 30 minutes during the daytime, and every 60 minutes in the evenings and on Sundays.

#### 135 SFU/Kootenay Loop

Afternoon rush hour service from SFU will be improved to alleviate overcrowding.

#### 136 Montecito/Brentwood

This route has been revised to provide a link between Montecito-Greystone and Brentwood Mall. Daytime buses will operate every 30 minutes; evening and Sunday buses every 60 minutes

#### 7 Capitol Hill/Kootenay Loop

Departure times throughout the week will be adjusted.

#### 139 Burnaby Hts./Kootenay Loop

This route has been changed to provide service from Pender at Willingdon to Kootenay Loop, via Willingdon, Eton, Gilmore and Hastings. Buses will operate every 30 minutes during rush hours and every 60 minutes at other times. For service along Delta Avenue, passengers should refer to the revised #134 route.

#### 140 Burnaby Hts./Kootenay Loop

Departure times throughout the day will be altered. During rush hours service will be improved to provide a bus every 30 minutes. In the evenings and on Sundays buses will now follow the same route as during the day.

#### 142 SFU/22nd St. Stn.

FASTTRAX

The route will be extended from Edmonds Station to 22nd Street Station to offer connections with New Westminster, Surrey, North Delta and White Rock services. In addition, #142 buses will be rerouted from Sperling to Duthie to provide SFU service to Montecito and Greystone.

### 143 Lougheed Park-Ride/SFU FAST TRAX

This new route will provide a direct connection between Lougheed Park-Ride Lot, Lougheed Mall and SFU. Buses will operate every 30 minutes during the morning and afternoon rush hours, Monday through Friday.

#### 144 SFU/Metrotown Stn.

TASTTRA

additional trip, leaving Metrotown Station at 8:30 a.m., improve rush hour service to SFU. There will now be 15-minute service during this time period.

## 145 Scott Rd. Park-Ride/SFU FAST TRAX

The #145 route will be extended to the Scott Road Park-Ride Lot (future Scott Road SkyTrain Station) and provide a direct Surrey-Lougheed Mall-SFU link. Buses on the extended portion of the route will operate every 30 minutes during rush hours. Local stops will be made in the Sapperton area of New Westminster.

#### 148 Belcarra/New Westminster Stn.

Two morning and afternoon rush hour trips will be introduced for a one-year trial period. Service operated during the summer to White Pine Beach will be discontinued.

#### 151 Lougheed Mall/Vancouver

PM rush hour service will be improved to alleviate overvding. In addition, departure times will be adjusted htly.

#### 160 South Port Coquitlam/Vancouver

Morning rush hour service will be improved to alleviate overcrowding. In addition, departure times throughout the week will be adjusted.

#### 162 River Springs/Vancouver

PM rush hour leave times from Vancouver will be adjusted.

#### 163 Prairie/Vancouver

An additional trip, leaving Vancouver at 5:35 p.m., will provide later service to the Coquitlam Park-Ride Lot. Vancouver leave times will also be adjusted.

#### 164 Coast Meridian/Vancouver

PM rush hour leave times from Vancouver will be altered.

#### 166 Coquitlam Centre/Westwood Plateau

This new rush hour route will provide 30-minute loop service between Westwood Plateau and Coquitlam Centre, via Noons Creek Drive, David and Lansdowne.

#### 215 Indian River/Phibbs Exchange

Two additional trips, leaving Phibbs Exchange at 6:00 and 6:30 p.m., will improve PM rush hour service.

## 236 Grouse Mtn./Pemberton Hts./Lonsdale

Service between Grouse Mountain and Lonsdale Quay will operate hourly on the fall schedule, until October 9. With the beginning of fall classes, the three trips to the W.E. Lucas ntre will be reinstated. (Since the 30-minute Grouse countain service will operate on Labour Day, these changes will become effective on September 5.)

#### 239 Capilano College/Park Royal

Morning and afternoon rush hour service between Phibbs Exchange and Capilano College will be improved to provide a bus every 15 minutes.

#### 286 North Vancouver/UBC

The service will be reinstated with the start of fall classes at UBC.

#### 292 Upper Lynn Valley/Vancouver

Outbound buses will be rerouted to continue on Hwy. #1 to the Mountain Hwy. off-ramp. The new route will save approximately six minutes for afternoon commuters.

#### 314 Panorama Ridge/22nd St. Stn.

Morning and afternoon rush hour departure times will be adjusted.

#### 319 Scottsdale Mall/New Westminster Stn.

Morning rush hour service will be improved to reduce overcrowding between Scottsdale Mall and the Scott Road Park-Ride Lot. In addition, to accommodate passenger demand, Saturday afternoon service will be improved to provide a bus every 15 minutes.

#### 325 Whalley Exch./West Newton

Departure times on Saturday will be adjusted to provide a better combined #325/#326 service on 140th Street.

## 330 Fleetwood/Guildford/New Westminster Stn.

Morning rush hour service will be improved to provide a bus every 10 minutes between Guildford and New Westminster Station. In addition, some morning and afternoon rush hour trips will be extended to Fleetwood (152nd St. and Fraser Hwy.) These extensions, combined with the #395 service, will provide a 15-minute rush hour service between Fleetwood and New Westminster Station.

#### 340 Newton Exch./22nd St. Stn.

Morning and afternoon rush hour departure times will be adjusted.

#### 351 Crescent Beach/Vancouver

An extra morning rush hour trip will reduce overcrowding. In addition, to accommodate passenger demand, Saturday service will be improved to provide a bus every 30 minutes. Departure times throughout the day have also been adjusted.

#### 352 White Rock Centre/Vancouver

354 White Rock South/Vancouver

390 Scott and 96th Ave./22nd St. Stn.

391 Scott and 96th Ave./22nd St. Stn.

Rush departure times have been adjusted.

#### 353 Ocean Park/22nd St. Stn.

Rush hour departure times have been adjusted, and Sunday and Holiday summer service will be discontinued after Labour Day (September 4).

#### 395 Fleetwood/New Westminster Stn.

The #395 trip leaving Fleetwood (152 St. & Fraser Hwy.) at 6:37 a.m. will now operate as a #330 trip. The combined #330 and #395 services will provide 15-minute service between Fleetwood and New Westminster Station.

#### 404/405 Ladner Exch./Airport

With the introduction of the Massey Tunnel counter flow lane, afternoon rush hour departure times will be adjusted.

#### 408 Garden City/Richmond Exchange

An additional trip will leave Richmond Exchange at 5:01 p.m. (extension of #401 Richmond Exchange trip from downtown Vancouver).

#### 490 Steveston/Vancouver

Morning rush hour departure times have been adjusted.

## 501 Langley South/New Westminster Stn. 502 Brookswood/New Westminster Stn.

Inbound buses will now stop to drop off passengers, and outbound buses to pick up passengers, at King George and 128th Street. This will permit direct transfers to and from the 145 SFU service.
