Single zone fares (use your single zone FareSavers) apply system-wide on holidays and a DayPass or valid FareCard will allow unrestricted travel throughout the service day.



SkyBridge designers win awards

SkyBridge, the world's longest transit span and the world's only cable-stayed bridge designed solely for carrying rapid transit, has won an award of excellence for its designers: Bush Bohlman - Reid Crowther.

All entries in the annual awards competition sponsored by Canadian Consulting Engineer magazine and the Association of Consulting Engineers of Canada were judged on evidence of a high quality of engineering, having due regard for imagination and innovation.

SkyBridge was also named a winner in the 1989 PCI (Precast/ Prestressed Concrete Institute) Design Awards Program. Its design was one of four chosen from more than 120 highcalibre entries in the international contest.

New Suburban Buses Serve White Rock/ South Delta

Over the past two months BC Transit has introduced 20 new buses on the White Rock and South Delta express routes.

The new buses, MCI Classics, are specially designed for long distance freeway routes. Features designed for greater passenger comfort include: upholstered bucket seats, more forward-facing seats, increased leg and head room, and interior reading lights.

Unlike many of the old suburban buses the new Classics have both front and rear doors for improved loading and unloading. This feature will also be useful in the event they have to be used on urban routes in an emergency

The new Suburban MCI Classics will initially be restricted to the #350 series and #600 series routes operating out of Oakridge Transit Centre.

Suburban buses are generally used on routes with over one hour travel time and/or routes where buses operate for extended periods of time on high speed roadways. Unfortunately suburban buses cannot be assigned to all such routes because of the limited number available.

1990/91 Annual Service Plan Revised

On July 6, 1989, the Vancouver Regional Transit Commission approved in principle the 1990/91 Annual Service Plan for the Vancouver Regional Transit System, and requested that BC Transit present it at a series of public meetings.

The draft Plan proposed expanded service throughout the region, particularly during rush hours. It estimated that 29 new vehicles would be required, increasing peak capacity by 3.7 per cent and providing 23,050 new service hours.

A detailed draft of this Plan was circulated to municipal councils for comments, and it was discussed in detail at six public meetings in September, attended by 197 people.

As a result of public and municipal input, the draft plan was revised to include two additional options.

• The first option would provide a further 25,000 hours of service with an additional 15 rush hour vehicles.

• The second option would provide an additional 50,000 hours of service with 20 more rush hour vehicles.

At the October 5th meeting, the Vancouver Regional Transit Commission approved Option 2.

When combined with the improvements in the original draft plan, Option 2 will increase overall rush hour vehicle requirements by up to 49 vehicles, representing a 6.2 per cent increase in system capacity. Service hours will increase by up to 73,050 (116,000 on an annual basis - or 4 per cent).

Frequency will be improved on 35 routes and 20 new routes will be introduced. For rush hour riders this means that some overcrowding will be reduced, while for many non-peak riders buses will come more often, particularly on Sundays. Ridership projections for next year show an increase of 4 to 5 per cent over this year.

*High Occupancy Vehicle

The Barnet Highway, presently a two-lane roadway between Port Moody and Burnaby, is very congested during rush hours, with BC Transit buses carrying approximately 20 per cent of the 3,000 rush hour riders using the corridor.

Because of delays, rush hour service from Coquitlam Centre to downtown Vancouver presently takes up to 80 minutes. But relief appears to be on the way. The Ministry of Transportation and Highways is proposing to widen the highway to include an V lane for car pools (3 or more persons) and buses.

SuperBus system

To take full advantage of the HOV-bus lane, it is proposed that the existing Barnet bus service be upgraded by introducing new 110-passenger articulated buses.

At the same time a two-tier express bus system would go into effect:

- The first route would provide regular express service with local stops through Port Moody and stops at transfer points along Hastings Street. Travel time to downtown Vancouver would be approximately 55 minutes.

 The second route, named the SuperExpress, would leave from Coquitlam Centre during rush hours, pick up passengers at a couple of stops in Port Moody and then travel non-stop to downtown Vancouver. Travel time to downtown Vancouver would be approximately 45 minutes.

Park & Ride and Transit Exchange



A key element in the SuperBus system would be an enlarged Park & Ride lot at Coquitlam Centre - it would have up to 1,000 parking spaces and bays for up to 14 buses at any given time.

Local feeder buses from the new Westwood Plateau development and future links from Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows would connect with the SuperBus at this point.

The Park & Ride lot would also be available as a Park & Pool lot for those who prefer to carpool and use the new HOV lane.

If approved, the proposed timing is as follows:

- June 1990 Completion of Park Ride and transit exchange.
- Sept. 1990 Improvements in Port Moody to assist buses on St. John's.
- Early 1991 BC Transit to take delivery of articulated buses.
- Mid-1992 Full HOV Lane bus lane in operation.
