The change given out in loonies and other coins keeps more coins in circulation for use in bus fareboxes, and this has saving helped cut our cost of money handling substantially. The saving helps passengers too by supporting more transit service saving helps passengers too by supporting more transit services.

As regular Sky Train and SeaBus riders know, ticket machines at the stations and terminals have been accepting \$5 bills, as well as \$2 bills, \$1 bills and coins, for several months.


