Apply for a HandyPass

Anyone with a disability may apply for a BC Transit Han-dyPass. This is a photo-identity card that entitles the registered user to Concession fares throughout the system.

During the phase in of liftequipped bus service, all passengers with a valid HandyPass are entitled to travel free on accessible bus routes, SkyTrain and SeaBus. Apply now by calling 264-5000, local 5101

GoCards for grades 8-12

A GoCard Transit Strip transforms an ordinary student card into a GoCard which will identify you as someone eligible to travel on the Vancouver Regional Transit System for a Concession fare.

To be eligible for a GoCard you must:

- O live within the transit service area.
- O be aged 14 to 19 (inclusive) or be in grade 8 at the start of the school year.
- attend classes full time at a public or private school - grades 8 to 12 (inclusive).

IF THE SCHOOL PHOTO SESSION WAS MISSED

Students may go to Photo Ident, 3640 Vanness Avenue, Vancouver (near Joyce SkyTrain Station) Phone 434-1321.

No appointment is necessary and a GoCard will be issued immediately. The hours are 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday. A GoCard application form (available at the school office) signed by a school official, proof of age (birth certificate or passport) and a \$5 fee are required.

OR... students may apply for a GoCard by mail. See the school secretary for details.

Beginning October 27, GoCard photography sessions will also be provided in a mobile unit at locations throughout Greater Vancouver. Look right to the adjoining column for a list of locations and dates.

IN THE MEANTIME

Students with 1989/90 GoCards who are still attending secondary school can use them until October 31, 1990, or until they receive their new ones.

New Grade 8 students will be able to pay Concession fares without a GoCard until October 31, 1990. Students should advise the driver of their age, grade and school when boarding. If any difficulties are encountered they are requested to pay the adult fare, then note the time of travel, bus number and operator number and call BC Transit operations at 264-5266 with this information.

Older students who have lost their GoCards should go immediately to Photo Ident. (See address and other requirements above)

STUDENTS...PLEASE REMEMBER

Your GoCard cannot be used by anyone else

A GoCard cannot be used by anyone other than the person to whom it was issued. If the photograph on the Card doesn't match the face of the user, the Card will be confiscated.

It should also be remembered that anyone using someone else's Card is obtaining transportation by fraud - a criminal offence.

Students who leave the school system must return their Cards to the school principal.

UNLIMITED TRAVEL WITH A ONE-ZONE FARECARD

- 1. Make tracks to your student union for a Fast Trax Transit Strip for your student I.D.
- 2. Purchase a one-zone monthly FareCard (yellow) for \$50.
- 3. Show both when you board and ride one, two or three zones, anytime, for a one-zone fare.

SUNDAY SERVICE ON THANKSGIVING

On Thanksgiving, Monday, October 8, Vancouver Regional Transit Services will operate on Sunday schedules. From Scott Road Station the first and last SkyTrains will leave at 8:15 am and 11:45 pm.

From Waterfront Station the first and last SkyTrains will leave at 8:50 am and 12:15 am.

From North Vancouver the first and last SeaBuses will leave at 8:33 am and 11:03 pm.

From Vancouver the first and last SeaBuses will leave at 8:47 am and 11:17 pm.

Single zone fares (use your single zone FareSavers) apply system-wide on holidays and a DayPass or valid Fare-Card will allow unrestricted travel throughout the day.



Beginning Monday, October 8, bicycles will be allowed on SeaBus during off-peak hours (9:30 am to 3:00 pm and after 6:30 pm, Monday through Friday, and all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays). A maximum of six bicycles will be permitted on each sailing.

Passengers are reminded that the fare for a bicycle is \$1.25, in addition to their own regular adult or concession fare.

The bicycle must remain in the control of the owner at all times and must NOT be ridden on or off SeaBus. This includes the use of ramps, walkways and sidewalks.

Cyclists should board through the SeaBus doorway closest to land and remain in the stern (rear) section. They should wait until other passengers have left before disembarking.
