

TIMETABLE UPDATES

The routing of the #335 service has been changed (not reflected in the May 21 issue of the Surrey timetable) between Scott Road Station and Guildford. The new route is as follows:

Scott Road Station to Guildford via access road, Scott Rd, 110th Ave, 128th St, 114th Ave, 124th St, Industrial Rd, 128th St, 115B Ave, 132nd St, 114th Ave, 133A St, 112A Ave, 134 St, 113th Ave, 140th St, 114A Ave, 140A St, Grosvenor, McBride, King, 116A Ave., Surrey Dr, Wallace, 148th St, 108th Ave, 150th St, 104th Ave to Guildford.

Guildford to Scott Rd. Station via 104th Ave, 150th St, 108th Ave, 148th St, Wallace, Surrey Dr, 116A Ave, King, McBride, Grosvenor, 140A St, 114A Ave, 140th St, 113th Ave, 136th St, 113th Ave, 134A St, 112A Ave, 133 St, 114th Ave, 128th St, 110th Ave.. into Scott Road Station.

In the evenings, Monday through Saturday, the route of the #353 service in the White Rock area is the same as the all-day Sunday and holiday route. As follows:

From White Rock Centre via Johnston, Pacific, Fir, Buena Vista, Finlay, Russell, Stayte, Marine, 130th St, 16th Ave to 128th, returning via 128th St, Marine, Stayte, Buena Vista, Fir, Pacific and Johnston to White Rock Centre.

In the #345 timetable, please note that **all** trips shown for Mon-Fri operate on Saturday as well, with the trip leaving White Rock Centre at 3:48 pm and Guildford at 5:05 p.m. operating Saturday only.

The Surrey #330 timetable shows a trip leaving Scott Road Station for Guildford at 3:10 pm, Monday through Friday. This is incorrect; the trip actually goes through to Fleetwood.

On page 9 of the Langley timetable the route description of the #501 Langley South/Scott Road Station, Monday through Saturday evenings and early Saturday mornings, should read as follows:returning to Langley Centre from 40th Ave. at 208th St. via 40th, 200th St, 53rd Ave, 203rd St, Douglas Crescent, 203rd St, Logan to Langley Centre.

In North Burnaby, the route of the #141 service is counter-clockwise while the #140 route is clockwise. The #141 route is as follows: From Kootenay Loop via Hastings, Gilmore, Eton, Boundary, Cambridge to turn-around; then via Cambridge, Boundary, Hastings and return to the Kootenay Loop

Vancouver's first wheelchair lift-equipped bus welcomed

The first of 85 wheelchair lift-equipped buses, scheduled to go into service in September, was introduced recently by Mayor Don Lanskaill, chairman of the Vancouver Regional Transit Commission, at a ceremony in front of Waterfront Station.

The Vancouver Regional Transit System will be the first transit system in Canada to provide a lift-equipped service that will allow people in wheelchairs access to the regular transit system.

"The Vancouver Regional Transit Commission and the BC Transit Board are committed to providing a fully accessible conventional transit system," said Mayor Lanskaill. "The first 85 buses are just a beginning, every new bus purchased in the future for the System

will come equipped with a wheelchair lift, and by the year 2006 the entire fleet will be accessible to those who use a wheelchair or have difficulty climbing stairs."

In September, the 85 new lift-equipped buses, representing 10 per cent of the Vancouver Regional Transit System fleet, will provide service on 22 routes. Each bus will have space for two wheelchairs. Between now and then, BC Transit will demonstrate the new equipment to interested community groups and allow future riders to familiarize themselves with the lift and tie-down procedures.

SERVICE LEVELS

Where service frequency is every 15 minutes or less, approximately 25 per cent of trips will be accessible. Where frequency is between 15 minutes and one hour, 50 per cent of trips will be accessible. Accessible trips will be identified in timetables.

Not all bus stops will be accessible. For September it is proposed that a minimum of 25 per cent of stops carry the international wheelchair logo, indicating that they are accessible.

handyDART SERVICE WILL CONTINUE

The handyDART system, which provides door-to-door service for people with disabilities, will complement accessible conventional transit. The new service will give many the freedom to make spontaneous trips and widen access to educational and employment opportunities.
