

TIMETABLE ADJUSTMENTS

Surrey, North Delta & White Rock timetable

The route description of the #323 should read: 138th St.(not King George Hwy.) in both directions.

The #330 Guildford/Fleetwood trip that leaves Scott Road Station at 3:09 pm, Monday through Friday, continues on beyond Guildford to Fleetwood.

The northbound #321trips that leave Newton at 6:15 and 7:15 am, Sundays and Holidays, continue on from Scott Road Station to New Westminster Station.

Langley timetable

On page 12, the 509 Walnut Grove Park & Ride/Scott Road Station is a Monday through Friday commuter service only and does not operate on Saturday, Sunday or Holidays.

On the same page, the #511 Saturday schedule should show an additional trip leaving Langley Centre for Aldergrove at 6:50 pm. This trip takes the Fraser Hwy route in both directions and on its return, leaves 272nd at Fraser Hwy (Aldergrove) at 7:41 pm, westbound to Langley Centre.

GoCards for grades 8-12

Beginning November 1, 1990, new Grade 8 students and students who have been using 1989/90 GoCards, must have 1990/91 GoCards when paying Concession fares on the Vancouver Regional Transit System.

Students who have missed their school photo session or have lost their GoCards can obtain one immediately by going to **Photo Ident, 3640 Vanness Avenue, Vancouver (near Joyce SkyTrain Station) Phone 434-1321.**

No appointment is necessary and a GoCard will be issued immediately. **The hours are 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday. A GoCard application form (available at the school office) signed by a school official, proof of age (birth certificate or passport) and a \$5 fee are required.**

Beginning October 27, GoCard photography sessions will also be provided in a mobile unit at locations throughout Greater Vancouver. See list of locations and dates below.

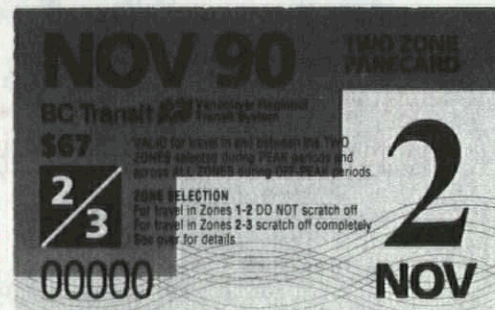
NEW LOOK FARECARDS

Beginning with the November issue, your monthly FareCard will have a strong, simple new design printed on a silver background. The best news, however, is that its value and convenience won't change one bit.

The One-Zone FareCard

offers one-zone rush hour travel and unlimited system-wide travel during non-peak hours. Only \$50 per month.

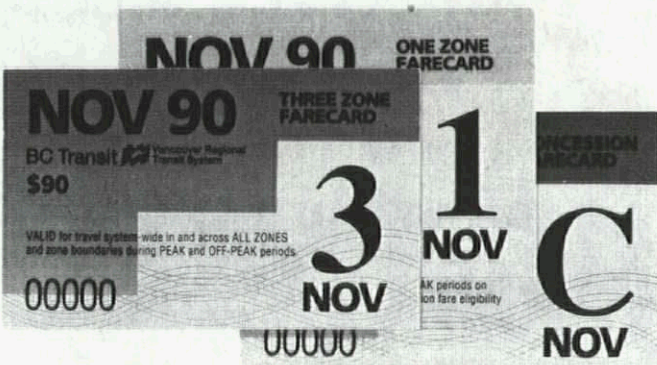

The Two-Zone FareCard

offers two-zone rush hour travel and unlimited system-wide travel during non-peak hours. A new feature of the two-zone FareCard is the replacement of the Urban/Suburban scratch off panel with a single enlarged Zone Selection Panel. Passengers who travel in zones 1-2 will leave the panel unscratched. Passengers travelling in Zones 2 & 3 will scratch off the grey panel to show the 2/3 printed below. Only \$67 per month.

The Three-Zone FareCard

offers unlimited system-wide travel throughout the service day. Only \$90 per month.

The Concession FareCard

offers unlimited system-wide travel throughout the service day to children 5-13 years, secondary school students 14-19 years with a valid GoCard and seniors 65+ years with proof of age. Only \$29 per month.

FareCards are sold during the last 5 and first 5 working days of each month at 7-Eleven, Ticketmaster, CIBC branch, Safeway, credit union, convenience store, smoke shop or drug store in your area.

MULTI-DIRECTIONAL 90-MINUTE TRANSFERS to be reintroduced

The Vancouver Regional Transit Commission has approved the reintroduction of 90-minute, multi-directional fare receipt/transfers for a six-month trial period, beginning November 1.

Transfers will continue to be valid only when used by the passengers to whom they were issued.

Passengers receiving a fare receipt/transfer from a BC Transit or West Vancouver bus driver, or from a ticket vending machine in a SeaBus terminal or Skytrain station, will have a minimum of 90 minutes to transfer to any other transit vehicle or series of vehicles going in any direction. While valid, the new transfer will, in effect, be a non-transferable "pass" with unlimited transfer privileges.

handyDART Service growing

With an increase of 42 percent in the number of registered users since 1989, demand for custom transit service has risen dramatically. "Individuals with disabilities are becoming more active in the community, and handyDART provides a vital service," says Vancouver Regional Transit Commission Chairman Mayor Don Lanskaill.

The Commission will therefore add 17 vehicles to the 139-vehicle handyDART fleet later this year, and it is proposed that another 20 vehicles go into service in the 1991/92 transit year. The operating budget will increase from \$8.2 to \$10.2 million in 1991/92.

BC Transit has also launched a demonstration project with Transport Canada to provide an improved reservation system. When the project is fully operational, Touch tone telephones will link handyDART riders directly with a computer, which will automatically phone back to remind them of their booked trips and schedules.

Wheelchair-accessible service on conventional buses

Lift-equipped buses are now providing service on 22 routes, giving many passengers with disabilities the freedom to make spontaneous trips and gain wider access to educational and employment opportunities.

In the first five weeks while the new service was being phased in, 286 passengers used the convenience of a lift to board a bus. We expect that figure to rise to between 7,500 and 10,000 next year as accessible bus service expands.

The most popular routes in this first few weeks were 22 Knight/Macdonald, 49 Metrotown/Dunbar, 25 Brentwood/Blanca and 1 Gastown/Beach.

Potential passengers who would like to go through the boarding procedure in an out-of-service, relaxed atmosphere, are invited to arrange a demonstration by contacting the BC Transit training department at 264-5420.

Ride Free with a HandyPass 'til Dec 31, 1990

Anyone with a disability may apply for a BC Transit HandyPass, a photo-identity card that entitles the registered owner to ride free on accessible bus routes, SkyTrain and SeaBus until Dec 31, 1990. After that, he/she can travel at Concession fares.
