BICYCLES CARRIED FREE ON SEABUS

The Vancouver Regional Transit Commission has decided that the extra fare for carrying bicycles on SeaBus (\$1.25) will be eliminated, beginning December 1.

This is the latest development in the Commission's efforts to improve cyclists' accessibility to transit. Next April, further progress will be made when a pilot bike-locker program begins to safely store bicycles at Scott Road Park & Ride, Ladner Exchange and Sexsmith Park & Ride.

(Please note that bicycles are allowed on SeaBus during off-peak hours - 9:30 am to 3:00 pm and after 6:30 pm weekdays, and all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays. A maximum of six bicycles are allowed on each sailing.)



WHEELCHAIR-ACCESSIBLE BUS STOPS

A major factor in the accessibility of wheelchairs to conventional lift-equipped buses is the condition of bus stops. The stops must have adequate landing areas for the lift and sufficient clearance for passengers to wheel on and off the lift without obstructing lanes, intersections or driveways. Consideration must also be given to the angle of the road to the sidewalk since this affects the operation of the lift. Many bus stops that appear to be accessible are located where the road has severe dips or crowns.

While BC Transit developed the engineering standards for accessible bus stops, and inspects and approves stops in cooperation with the municipalities involved, the maintenance and upgrading of bus stops are municipal responsibilities. Unless specific requests are received, the improvement of stops at transfer points and in areas with fewer accessible stops will be given priority.

For safety reasons, operators are instructed to activate the lift only at designated stops. Physically disabled passengers who would like to request that a particular stop on an accessible route be upgraded to accommodate lift-equipped buses may do so by calling the municipality or BC Transit's Planning Department at 264-5000.

FOCUS ON TRANSIT

Vancouver - Richmond Rapid Transit Project

PUBLIC OPEN HOUSES - 2nd Series

This project includes the planning, design and construction of a rapid transit system between downtown Vancouver and Richmond Centre. The current planning phase will indicate the best combination of route and rapid transit technology by mid-1991.

Following the first series of public meetings, held in July, the consultants, through a screening process, reduced the 200+ options to 10.

This second series of Open Houses has been planned to present the 10 options being considered for further evaluation. These will be followed by a series of Public Meetings in January 1991, held by the Vancouver-Richmond Rapid Transit Advisory Committee.
