These trips combined with the regular #147 and #148 service, will provide a bus every 15 minutes between Lougheed Mall and New Westminster Station. All buses will be lift-equipped.

When you pay a multi-zone bus fare ask for a receipt

Whether or not you plan to transfer to another bus, SkyTrain or SeaBus, it's essential that you ask for a transfer (fare receipt) when paying cash or a FareSaver ticket for a multizone, rush hour fare.

When you plan to remain on the same bus for the entire trip, the transfer (fare-receipt) provides proof of payment when a fare check is conducted at a zone boundary. Without this proof of payment you can be asked to pay an additional amount.

Popularity of Park & Ride lots doubles since 1989

The total number of cars using Park & Ride lots daily has doubled to nearly 3,200 since September 1989, and this has helped attract new customers to SkyTrain. A recent survey shows, for instance, that 91 per cent of the people who park in the Scott Road Park & Ride Lot use SkyTrain to get to their downtown jobs and that most of them stopped driving downtown because SkyTrain saves them money and gets them to work more quickly.

Other lots have shown big increases, including Lougheed at King Edward Street, 19.1 per cent, and Sexsmith in Richmond, 14.1 per cent.

BC Transit is looking at a number of ways to enhance service at Park & Ride lots. Increasing the number of parking spaces and enhancing feeder bus services are two of the initiatives being considered.

Spring schedules bring four new routes, improved service, special summer service, schedule adjustments and seasonal reductions to university service.

Some schedules will change April 15 and others on April 29. See inside spread for full details.

11% expansion planned. Additional local funding required

Demand for services on all four modes of the Vancouver Regional Transit System - bus, SeaBus, SkyTrain and handyDART - increased dramatically during the 1990/91 fiscal year which ended on March 31, 1991. To meet present needs and demands from municipalities for increased services in their areas, the Vancouver Regional Transit Commission is planning an 11 per cent expansion of operations in fiscal 1991/92.

Based on the current cost sharing formula with the province, additional funding will be required to meet the region's \$235.6 million share of the recommended 1991/92 budget. At current rates, the money collected from fares, the gas tax, the levy on residential electricity bills and the non-residential property tax would fall \$23.8 million short of what is required.

Fare increase being considered

The Vancouver Regional Transit Commission is considering raising fares by an average of eight per cent, beginning at the earliest on July 1, 1991. Public meetings will be held to discuss specific fare proposals.

The Commission will also be making proposals to the provincial government on additional funding sources, It will request that the government increase the gas tax in the Vancouver region by one cent per litre to provide an additional \$13 million in revenue. Other proposed sources of revenue are a five per cent increase in non-residential property tax and a 30 cent increase in the monthly hydro levy, to \$1.90 a month. This would be the first increase in the hydro levy since 1986.

"After exploring a variety of alternatives, the Commission concluded these increases are reasonable and practical." said Commission chairman Mayor Murray Dykeman. "Increasing demands for public transit means that BC Transit must enhance capacity on existing routes and extend new services to communities. These steps are essential for providing a quality transit service for Lower Mainland residents," added Mayor Dykeman
