Proposed Transit Fare Changes

The Vancouver Regional Transit Commission is considering changes to the current transit fare levels which have been in effect since June 1, 1988.

The public are invited to attend a meeting with Commission members on:

Wednesday, May 29 at 7:00 pm in the auditorium of Windermere Secondary School 3155 East 27th Avenue Vancouver

To get there by transit:

Windermere Secondary School is located approximately four blocks north-east of 29th Avenue Station. Take SkyTrain or one of two bus routes to the station: #26 29th Ave Station or #29 29th Ave Station. At the station, transfer to a #16 Downtown bus. Those on the #16 29th Ave Station route can take a bus directly to the school.

The Vancouver Regional Transit Commission has approved an eight per cent general increase in fares in order to fund the local share of 1991/92 transit expenditures.

This could be raised by increasing the base adult cash fare by 10 cents, from \$1.25 to \$1.35, and by corresponding increases in rush hour fares.
