

Timetable Revisions, effective Sept 2

Surrey, North Delta & White Rock timetable

The following routes have been revised:

#321 and #390 buses southbound from King George Highway will travel via 152nd St, 18th Ave, Martin and North Bluff to White Rock Centre (Bay #1). The northbound route will not change and will continue to leave White Rock Centre from Bay #5.

#353 buses from 22nd Street Station to Ocean Park will travel via 152nd St to White Rock Centre (Bay #3), then via 152nd St, Russell and the regular route to Ocean Park.

#340 buses from #10 Hwy to Cloverdale terminus will travel via the Cloverdale By-Pass, 57th Ave and 177B St to 58th Ave.

#354 White Rock and 356 Cranley buses will leave from Bay #2.

Coquitlam timetable

Some route revisions were made after the Coquitlam timetable was printed and it was too late to change the map showing the downtown section of the routes. Monday through Saturday, #160 buses will travel from Hastings to Helmcken via Burrard, Nelson and Hornby. Eastbound buses will travel via Hornby, Smithe and Burrard to Hastings. Monday through Friday, #190 buses will follow these same routes.

On Sunday, #160 buses will temporarily be routed to Burrard & Georgia from Hastings via Howe and Georgia. Eastbound buses will travel from Burrard & Georgia to Hastings via Burrard and then follow the regular route.

The #162, 163, 164 and 165 routes will no longer operate to and from Vancouver during the A.M. and P.M. rush hours. See the individual schedules.

In the Mayfair Industrial area, #159 New Westminster Station buses will travel via United Blvd, Shuswap, Glacier, Golden, United Blvd and then follow the regular route. In addition, "limited service" Meridian Industrial trips will be routed via McLean and Kingsway (instead of Langan) to Broadway.

The #190 schedule shows a trip leaving Hornby at Helmcken at 5:16 pm. This trip will operate as a #160. See #160 schedule.

Langley service changes, effective Sept 2

The #506 and #511 routes will change slightly in the vicinity of Langley Centre. Westbound buses will now operate via Fraser Hwy to 203 St. Westbound #506 buses will operate via 208 St, Fraser Hwy, 203 St and Logan to Langley Centre, while #511 buses will operate via 56 Ave, 206 St, Fraser Hwy, 203 St and Logan to Langley Centre.

Please note that the #501, #502 (peak periods) and #506 (P.M. direction) routes around Langley Centre will change slightly with the completion of work at Glover Road and Fraser Hwy. Watch the Buzzer for further details.

New Park & Riders should note that Loughheed Park & Ride lot is at the intersection of Loughheed Hwy and King Edward Ave and is clearly marked. Transit riders mistakenly parking at Loughheed Mall Shopping Ctr. may have their cars towed.



Proposed dates for the introduction of Accessible bus service on 24 additional routes

With the purchase of 131 new wheelchair lift-equipped buses, including 21 articulated SuperBuses, accessible bus service is being introduced to North Vancouver, Richmond, Surrey, White Rock and Burnaby, and more accessible service is being added in the TriCity area.

Service will be phased in over the next four months as bus stops are converted to accommodate wheelchairs and lifts. The new buses are also being retrofitted to enable them to handle three-wheel scooters, and will be accessible to both wheelchairs and scooters on the start dates listed below.

Please note that although the start date for the #239 route was listed as September 2 in the August 16 Buzzer, it has now been postponed to October 7 to allow scooter attachments to be installed.

GoCards for students in Grades 8 to 12

Who is eligible?

High school students who:

- live within the transit service area
- are aged 14 to 19 (inclusive) or are in Grade 8 at the start of the school year
- attend classes full time at a public or private school - Grades 8 to 12 (inclusive)

are eligible to apply for a GoCard and to use it to travel on the Vancouver Regional Transit System for Concession fares (approximately half of adult fares)

The student must carry and be able to show their Go Card or pay the adult fare.

Getting your GoCard is easy

A GoCard Transit Strip transforms an ordinary student card into a GoCard.

The necessary photograph will be taken at an in-school photography session and the card will be issued approximately two weeks later.

There will not be a charge for GoCards issued as a result of this in-school photography session...so make certain you don't miss it.

In the meantime

Students with 1990/91 GoCards, who are still attending secondary school, can use them until October 31, 1991. If the GoCard has been lost over the summer it should be replaced immediately by going to:

Hours are 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday. No appointment is necessary. A GoCard application form (available at the school office) signed by a school official, proof of age (birth certificate or passport) and a \$5 fee are required.

New Grade 8 students will be able to pay Concession fares without a GoCard until October 31, 1991. These students should advise the driver of their age, grade and school when boarding. If any difficulties are encountered they are requested to pay the adult fare, then note the time of travel, bus number and operator number and call BC Transit Operations at 264-5266 with this information.

If you miss the school photo session

GoCard photography sessions will be provided by Apple Photographic Services during October and November, in a mobile unit at locations throughout Greater Vancouver. Watch for details.

Or students may go to Photo Ident, 2640 Vanness Avenue, Vancouver, between 9:00 am and 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday. No appointment is necessary.

Students going to Photo Ident or a mobile unit must have a GoCard application form (available at the school office) signed by a school official, proof of age (birth certificate or passport) and a \$5 fee. GoCards will be issued immediately.

Remember... your GoCard cannot be used by anyone else

A GoCard cannot be used by anyone other than the person to whom it was issued. If the photograph on the GoCard doesn't match the face of the user, the GoCard will be confiscated. It's important to remember that misuse of a GoCard is obtaining transportation by fraud - a criminal offence.

Students who leave the school system must return their cards to the school principal.

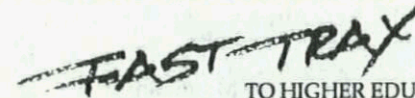
Elementary students pay Concession fares

Elementary school students, aged 5 to 13, are eligible to travel on the Vancouver Regional Transit System for Concession fares (approximately half of adult fares).

High school students with GoCards pay Concession fares

Post-secondary students can have unlimited travel with a one-zone FareCard



TO HIGHER EDUCATION

With a Fast Trax Transit Strip, available at student unions, attached to their student I.D.'s, post secondary students can travel throughout the system, anytime, on a regularly priced adult, one-zone monthly FareCard. Cost \$50.

Both I.D. and FareCard must be shown when boarding or when requested.

Concession fares

Cash, Concession tickets or Concession FareCards can be used to pay fares:

Handy Concession tickets, good for one zone travel during rush hours and one way travel throughout the system at all other times, are available in books of 20 for \$14 at transit FareDealer outlets.

OLD-PRICE FARESAVERS: Please remember that on Sunday, September 1, new FareSaver fares become effective. Any old-price FareSavers you have left can be upgraded to the new fare by purchasing a special fare upgrade. Details are posted on all ticket vending machines. On buses add 10 cents with a 1-zone, 25 cents with a 2 or 3-zone and 5 cents with a Concession FareSaver.

Transit to the Indy

Transit is your best route to the Molson Indy, August 30 and 31 and September 1. Let SkyTrain whisk you right to the Main St Station for Grandstands 1, 2 & 14 and the Pit Suites, or Stadium Station for all other locations. From Stadium Station walk south on Beatty to the Terry Fox Plaza entrance. The #3, 8, 19, 10, 14, 16 and 20 bus routes will also take you to within a short walk.

If you are already downtown, the 15 Cambie and 17 Oak routes also provide service to the area. (Please note that the #15 and 17 will be rerouted into downtown via Granville Street Bridge, with some minor rerouting within the downtown area. Leaving downtown there are no changes).

ADDITIONAL SUNDAY SERVICE, SEPT 1

SkyTrain will begin operating one hour earlier, leaving Scott Road Station at 7:15 am.

SeaBus will begin operating one hour earlier, leaving Lonsdale Quay at 7:32 am.

To coincide with earlier SkyTrain service, two additional trips will be provided on each of the following bus routes:

#321 Scott Road Station will leave Newton Exch at 6:45 and 7:45 am.
#330 Scott Road Station will leave Guildford Exch at 7:03 and 7:33 am.
#501 Scott Road Station will leave 40th Ave & 208 St, Langley at 6:28 and 8:28 am.
