


Route change: 159 Port Coquitlam Centre/ New Westminster Stn



Booking trips now easier for Vancouver handyDART passengers

handyDART provides a door-to-door transit service for people with disabilities who are unable to use conventional transit. In 1990, BC Transit started a demonstration project, in conjunction with the Transportation Development Centre of Transport Canada, to design and test an automatic telephone response system developed by Oracle Communications Inc. This technology now allows the handyDART contract operator in Vancouver, Pacific Transit Cooperative, to provide passengers with touchtone phones direct access to its computer at any time of the day or night. They no longer have to wait when office staff are busy and can book one-time trips four to six days in advance by leaving a voice record, cancel or confirm a booked trip, or obtain information. Instructions on using the new booking function are being provided to handyDART users on board the vehicles. Additional information is available by calling Pacific Transit Cooperative at 430-2692.
